Candidates Considered for County Auditor to Be Elected Next Year

With the office of county auditor that officials believe will be the most potent of any so far as a voice in the political phases of county gov-ernment is concerned to be estab-lished next year, only two men are talked of as probable seekers of the place, Waukegan reports state.

"But the woods will be full of 'em in the spring," comment political followers.

The two who are said to be look-ing into the possibilities of the Re-publican nomination are former City Commissioner Robert J. Pearsall, deputy county clerk, who now is

working with the clerical staff of the board of review, and Henry Wal-lenwein, justice of the peace.

Politicians believe that many oth-ers may be nursing secret ambitions for the place, but so far have not yet made them known.

The office of county auditor, which is established in all counties when the census shows the population to have surpassed 75,000 creates a po-sition in which the holder takes away many of the perquisites of the county board of supervisors.

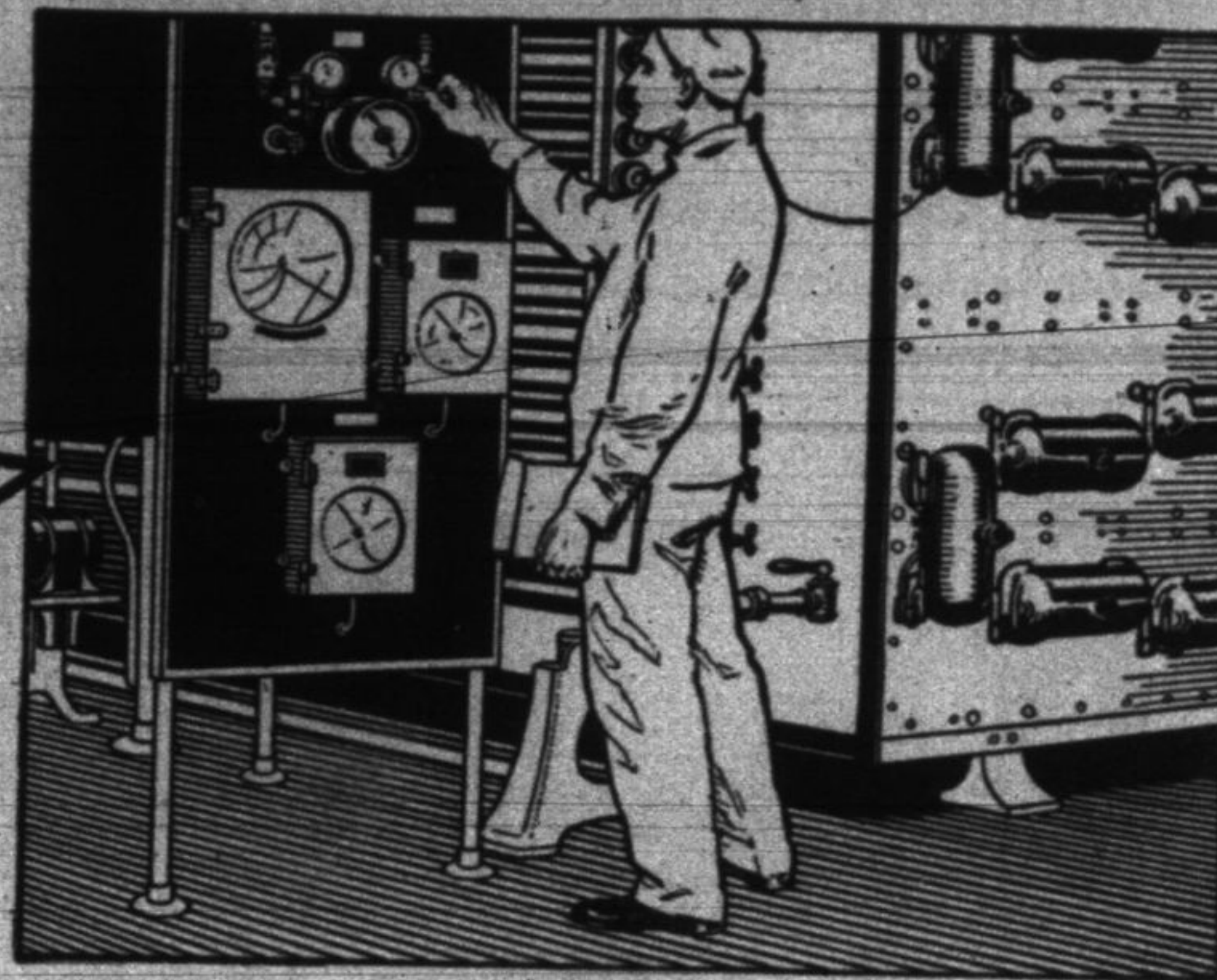
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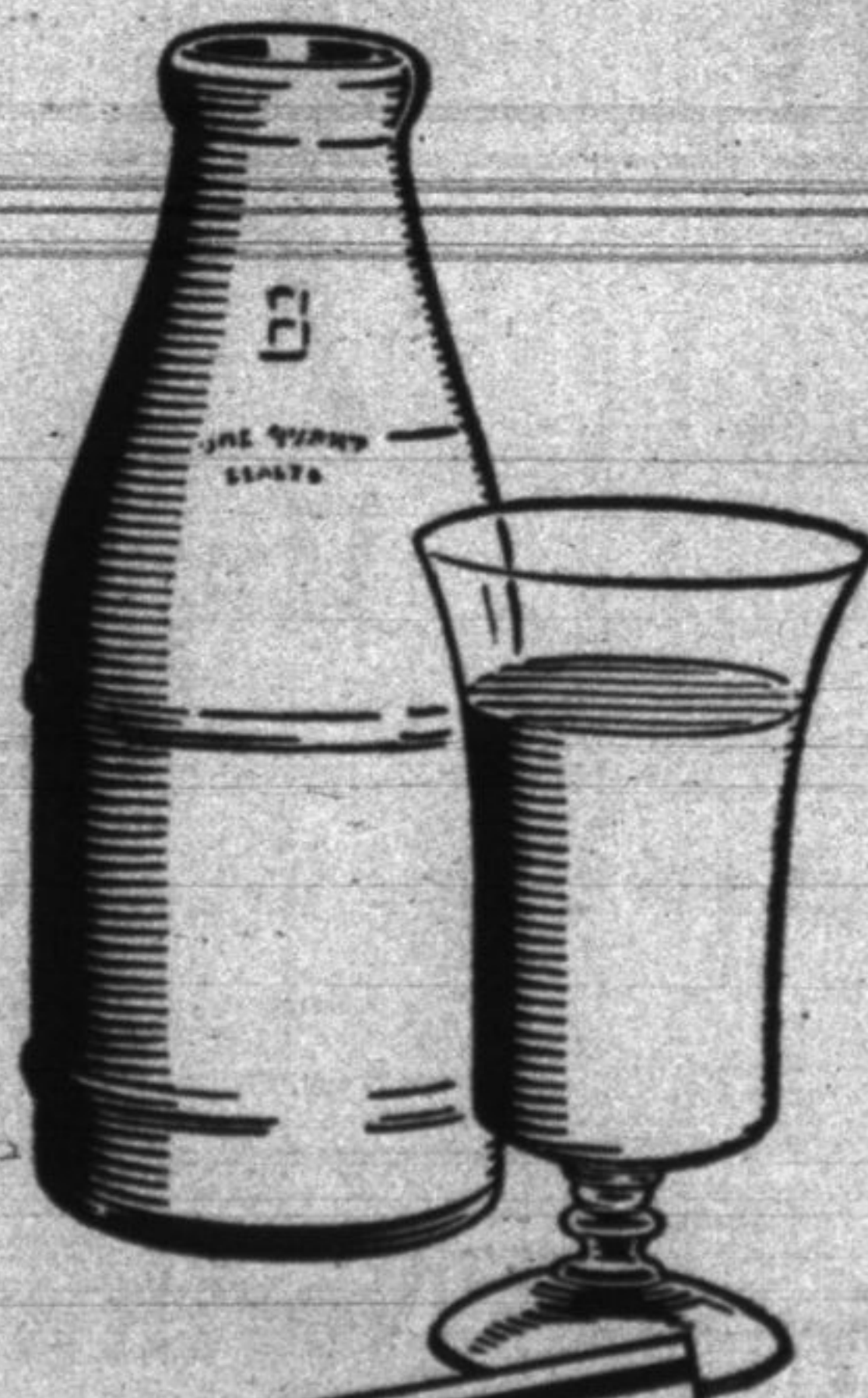
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
