**STANLEY T. SANTI
 KILLED LAST NIGHT**

turning over, violently throwing young Santi to the pavement. He was rushed to the Highland Park hospital where he died about 11:30. The four other occupants of the car Ossian Carlson, driver, Marino Macstic, Gilbert Barruffi, and Junior Curley were uninjured. Santi was sitting in the front seat with the driver.

Stanley was twenty-two years old and was married June 21st to Miss Angeline Maggiori of Chicago. They made their home on Oakridge avenue, Highwood. Stanley had lived in Highwood all his life with his father and mother who had made their home there for the past twenty-four years.

He was a graduate of the Oak Terrace school and later attended Deerfield-Shields high school where he was center on the football team from his freshman to his senior year, being captain of the team the last year.

Everyone in this vicinity will recall Santi as the husky center who starred on the high school team for four years, during which time he made a great many remarkable plays, and helped pull his team out of a hole on many occasions. He was well liked by all who knew him in Highland Park and Highwood and along the north shore who will regret to learn of his accident and untimely demise.

He was vice-president and stockholder in Santi Bros., Inc., of Highwood.

Funeral services will be from the house to St. James church, Saturday morning at nine-thirty o'clock, the Rev. Fr. Holly officiating. Burial will be in Memorial Park cemetery.

Stanley leaves to mourn his death his wife, mother and father, one brother, Sam Santi Jr., who is attending Western Military academy at Alton, Ill., and one sister, Theresa E. Santi.
