E. C. Schweitzer, Sr., Dies; Well Known in H. P.; Funeral Sat. P.M.

Edward Charles Schweitzer, Sr., a resident of Highland Park for several years and widely known here, died Wednesday morning in the St. Francis hospital, Evanston. He had been ill only about ten days and in the hospital a week. Until about a year ago the family lived here, but removed to Wilmette, their old home, while a new home was being erected on Green Bay road, in Ravinia. This home will be ready for use about November 1, it is expected. Previously they lived for several years at Cary and Rice streets.

Mr. Schweitzer was 61 years old last April. He was born in Chicago and had spent most of his life on the North Shore. He was for over 40 years a director in the Sprague-Warner wholesale grocery company and was on duty as usual the day he became ill. He was a member of the local Presbyterian church and a man with many warm friends in the community and throughout the North Shore, whose sorrow at the news of his death was profound.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Minnie Schweitzer, and their only son, Edward C. Schweitzer, Jr., of Highland Park.

The funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at Scott's funeral home, Greenleaf avenue, Wilmette, and burial will be in Memorial Park cemetery. The many friends in Highland Park extend their sincere sympathy to the relatives.

H. P. Soccer Team to Play Chicago Club Sunday, Sunset Park

The Chicago Sport club, one of the strongest teams in the International league, will meet the Highland Park soccer club at Sunset park next Sunday. The game will be called at 2:30 p.m.
