

### Legal Fight on Over Remapping Plan Will Affect 13th District

That a sharp contest is impending in the redistricting injunction case became more apparent last week, when Attorney General Oscar Carlstrom asked a week's additional time in which to prepare his answer to the injunction petition.

Judge Edward Shurtleff, presid-

ing at Belvidere, granted the continuance asked by the attorney general.

Especial interest in the case centers in the north shore section, since the outcome of the case is likely to affect the personnel of representation in congress.

Under the previous districting, the tenth district included a part of Chicago. The revision makes the district end at Evanston, taking in Evanston and the other north shore cities, but not Chicago.

### Report H. P. Family Robbed in Chicago

While the Harry J. Lowenbach family was moving into their Chicago home after spending the summer at their Highland Park residence, thieves entered the Chicago home and stole jewelry and clothing valued at \$20,000, Chicago police were told October 7. An investigation was ordered.

Mrs. Lowenbach and a maid left the Highland Park home yesterday, taking with them a casket containing jewelry valued at \$17,300 which they left in the Lowenbach apartment at 2912 Commonwealth avenue, Chicago. While they were on a shopping tour, thieves entered the apartment.

When Mrs. Lowenbach returned, they found that their rooms had been looted, clothing being scattered about the floor and all drawers emptied.

Besides the jewelry, the robbers took a \$1,200 fur coat and lingerie valued at \$1,500.

### Tentative Dates for Opening of Highways in This Part State

Tentative dates for the opening of several important state highways in Lake county and in adjoining counties have been announced by George N. Lamb of Elgin, state district engineer.

Opening of the highways in all cases are more than a month away while on some they will not be ready for travel until the first of next year.

#### Several Important Projects

Among the projects regarded as of most importance to residents of the county are those involving the construction of the viaduct over the Soo line tracks on Route 21 north of Lake Villa and the paving of two sections of Route 173.

According to the report the viaduct will not be completed and Route 21 between Lake Villa and Antioch will not be opened until January 1. This is certain to bring some moans from that section as the detours around the project have been in a deplorable condition for months while complaints as to the condition of the roads have been ignored by the state highway commission.

#### Delay on Route 173

The two paving projects in Lake county on Route 173 which extends from Zion to Rockford will be completed at various times. The stretch between Antioch and Rosecrans will be completed by November 15, 1932, the portion between Antioch and Richmond will be ready by December 1 while the bridge over the Fox river near Antioch will not be completed until January 1 at the earliest.

### Winter Rates Now at G. & R. Stables

The G & R Stables, Highland Park's pioneer riding stables, having been established here for over ten years, announces that their winter rates are now in effect.

### State's Attorney's Office Turns Fines in Totaling \$15,000

Fines totalling \$15,604 were turned over to the county coffers in the past three months by the office of State's Attorney A. V. Smith, according to the records of County Treasurer Jay B. Morse.

The list shows that fines were paid by 197 defendants. The payments range from \$5 to \$200.

The larger part of the list is made up of disorderly conduct and gaming cases, with a sprinkling of drunken driving and other charges.

The total is much larger than is usual as revenue from the activity of the office of state's attorney, and results from an active war against offenders waged by Col. Smith during the summer.

The amount has been turned over to Treasurer Morse in payments of \$2,000 to \$4,000 as the moneys accumulated during the three months.
