## First Lady Hopes to Attend Convention of Girl Scouts



IN reply to the invitation of Mrs. Frederick Edey, national president of the Girl Scouts, Mrs. Herbert Hoover has expressed the hope that she may be able to attend the annual Girl Scout convention which opens in Buffalo on October 14th. Mrs. Hoover has been attending these gatherings for over a decade, and at that held in Indianapolis in 1930 said: "Somehow

my year seems incomplete without a Girl Scout convention."

Now Honorary President of the organization, Mrs. Hoover has been an active worker in Girl Scouting for over eleven years. A former president, she was also chairman of the national board of directors, from which office she resigned in 1928.

### Believe Lake Zurich Woman's Death Was Due to Rat Poison

Investigation into the mysterious death of Mrs. Ida Ernst, of Lake Zurich, whose death was found due to poisoning, last week led State's Attorney A. V. Smith to believe that one of two things could have happened; that the woman ate poison by mistake or purposely.

Mrs. Ernst died September 10 in the Barrington hospital where she had been taken from her home in Barrington. Coroner Herman Bundesen, of Chicago, ordered an autopsy and an analysis of the biscera. The stomach revealed that she had eaten rat poison, according to Col. Smith, to whom the facts were submitted.

#### Husband Questioned

The husband, Col. Smith said, had been questioned by him several times. His story was that he ordered the analysis of the stomach. Assistant State's Attorney George McGaughey was of the opinion that it had been asked for by hospital physicians.

Mrs. Charles Leslie, at the request

of Mrs. Ernst, prepared the rat poison on crackers over which cheese was smeared. Mrs. Ernst told neighbors about the preparation and expressed the hope that she would be successful in killing the vermin, it is said.

Col. Smith has concluded that she could have made a mistake and eaten the wrong cracker and cheese, although he has been informed that she has worried some lately.

### Man Dies in Jungle Near Fort Sheridan

A man whose name was given as Pat, or Cornelius Kelley, aged about 50, died from exposure in a tramps' camp west of Fort Sheridan, in the woods west of the tracks, Sunday. Companions told Highwood and Lake Forest police who were called that Kelley had been ill after spending Saturday night in the rain. The body was taken to Lake Forest, and an inquest was held Sunday afternoon by Deputy Coroner Penny. The verdict was that death was due to acute alcoholism and exposure. Efforts were started to locate relatives.
