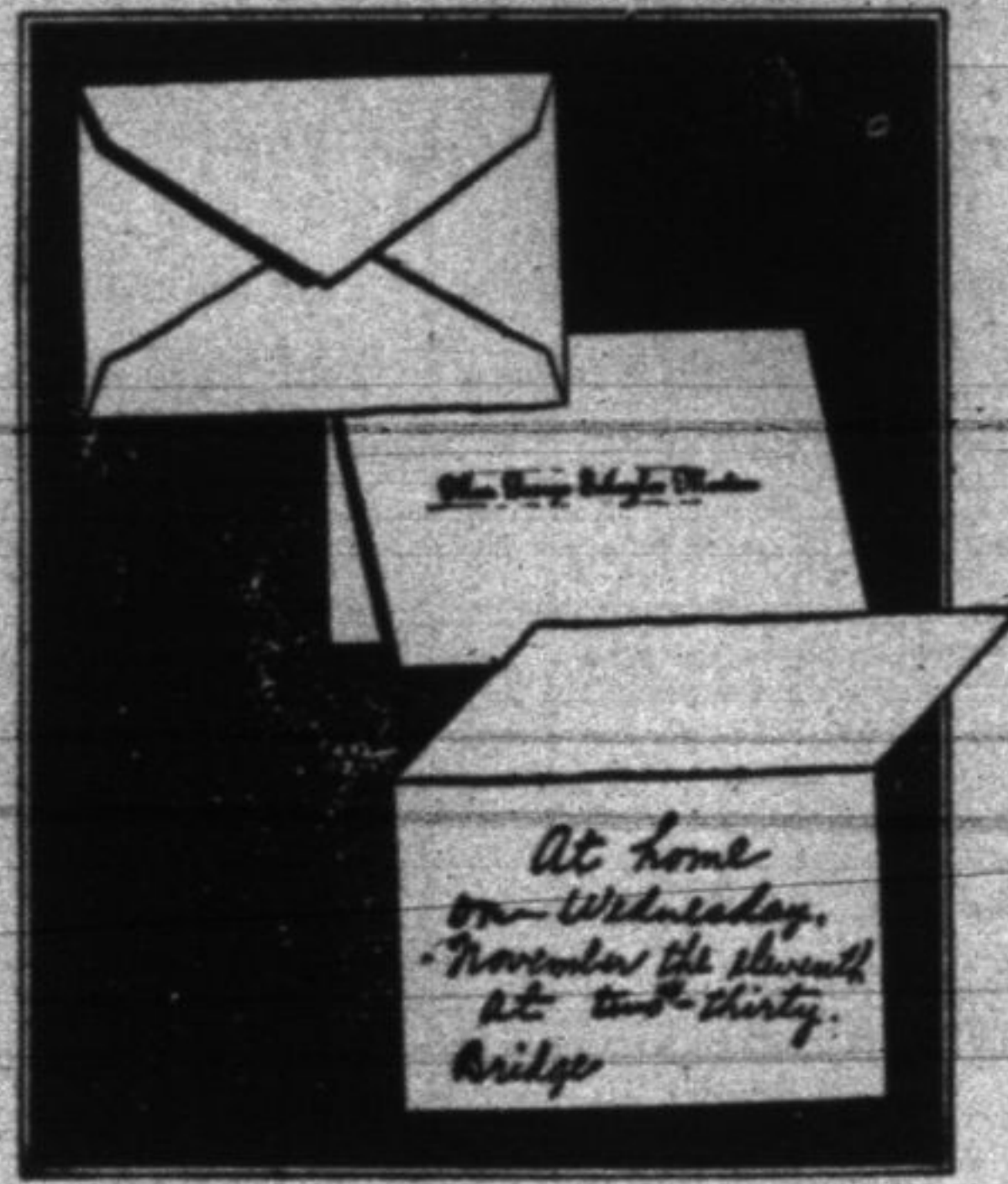

A. & P. Stores Sales Report for 4 Weeks

Sales of the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea company for the four week period ending September 26 were \$74,641,542. This compared with \$77,019,441 for the same period in 1930, and is a decrease of \$2,377,899, or 3.09%, says a recent bulletin from the company.

More goods were sold during the September period in 1931 than in the same period a year ago, as shown in the estimated tonnage figures. September sales, expressed in tons, were 411,886 this year, compared with 369,673 in September of 1930. This is a gain in quantity of merchandise sold of 42,210 tons, or 11.42%.

Average weekly sales in September were \$18,660,385 compared with \$19,254,860 in 1930, a decrease of \$594,475. Average weekly tonnage sales were 102,971 compared with 92,418 in September 1930, an increase of 10,553.

Approval by the War department of plans for a bridge across the Fox river, west of Antioch on Route 173, the new route being made from Zion to Rockford, was granted last week.

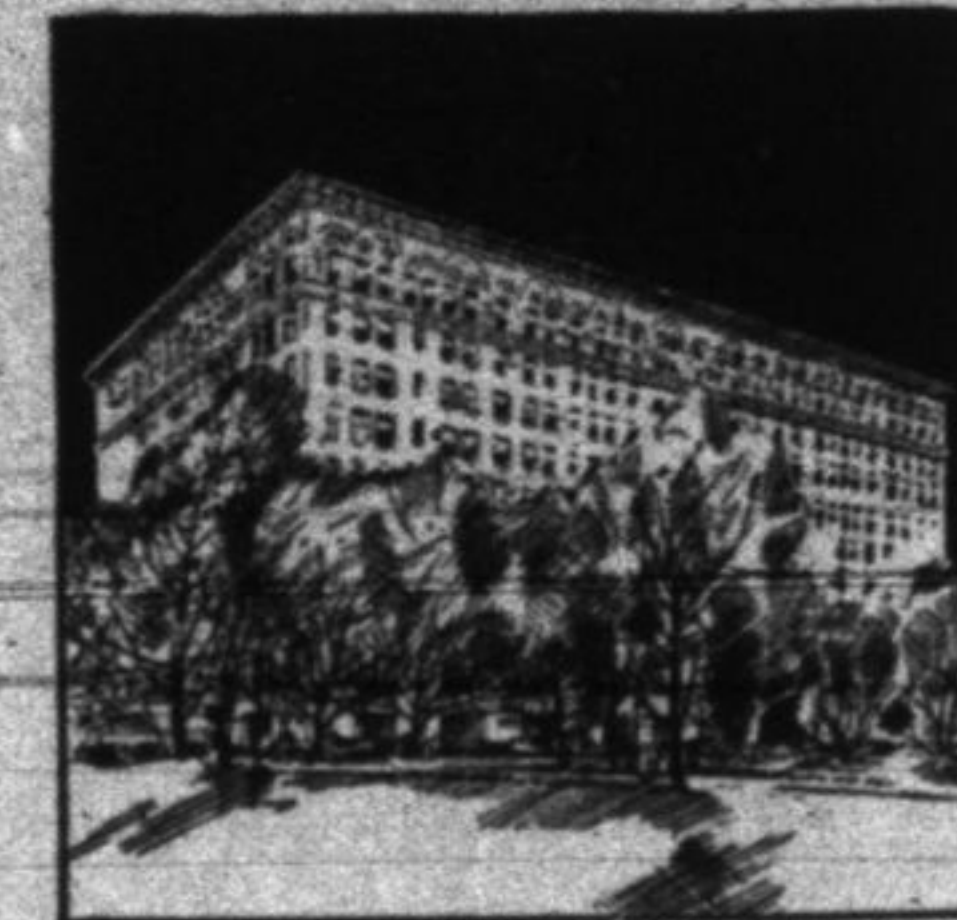
