Mr. and Mrs. A. O. Rockenbach of Crystal Lake visited at the Emil Giss home on Central avenue, Saturday.

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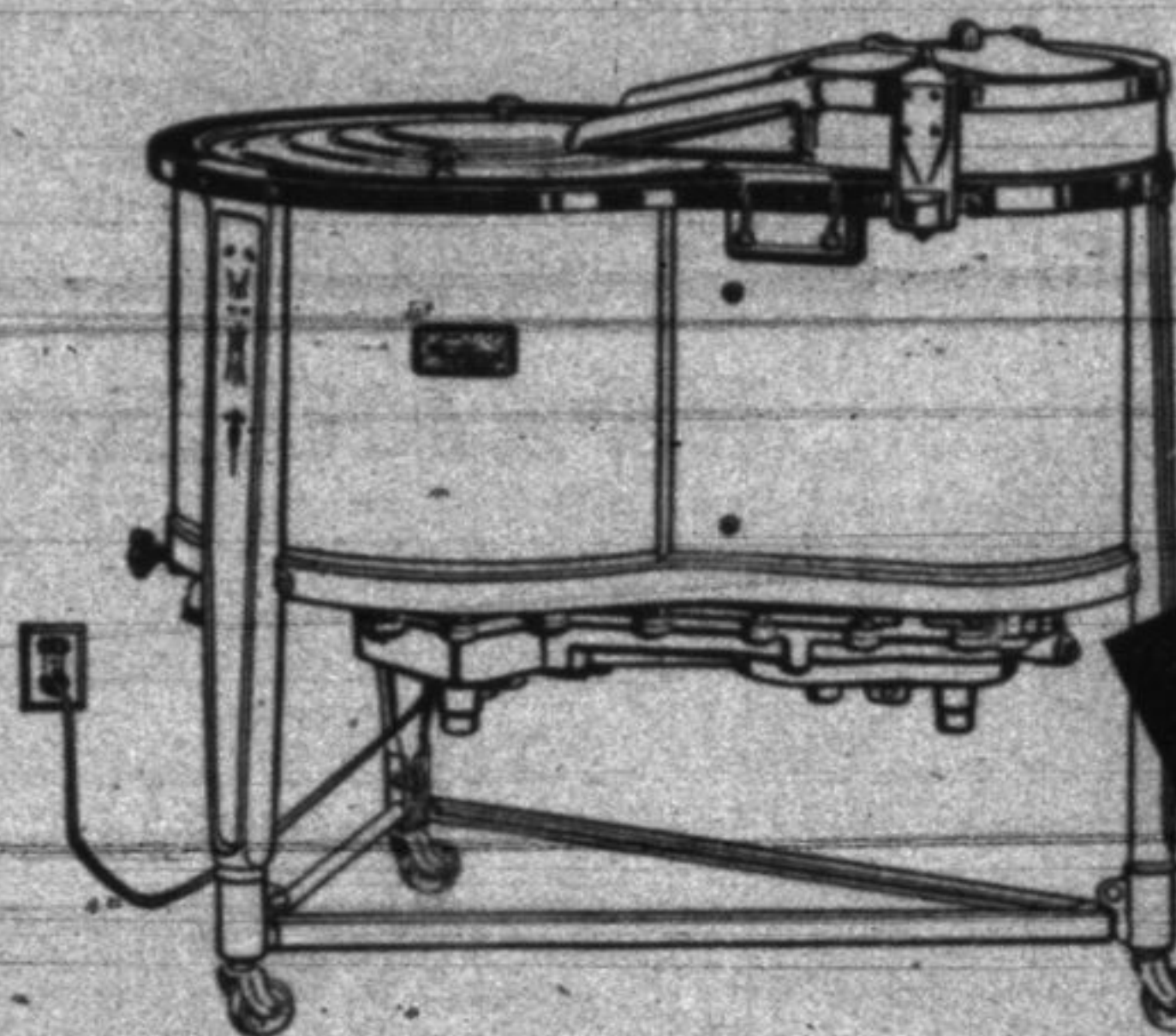
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
