

Big Navy Dirigible on Test Trip Sails to Milwaukee and Return; Features

The big dirigible, Akron, largest of its type, on Saturday morning flew leisurely over the north shore to Milwaukee and returned to Chicago by practically the same route. giving residents of Highland Park. Lake Forest and other north shore communities splendid views of this latest "queen of the air," and thousands of people all along the route watched the flight with interest.

Coming into view from the south at about 10:15 o'clock the ship moved slowly northward over Highland Park, Lake Forest, Lake Bluff, the Great Lakes Naval training station, North Chicago and Waukegan and then into the north. After circling the city of Milwaukee the giant dirigible again passed over these cities on the return trip southward.
