**SCOUT UNIVERSITY
OPENS AUSPICIOUSLY**

**More Than 100 Men at First
Leadership Training
Course Here**

The University of Scouting con-
ducted by the commissioners of the
North Shore Area council opened
Monday, Oct. 19 at the Elm Place
school in Highland Park with 110
scout leaders present.

Perry A. Lint, scout executive of
the Chicago council, opened the
course with a most inspiring address
about the "Kind of a Troop I
Should Like to Join If I Were 12
Years Old."

Leadership Training

After a half hour of general op-
ening, the assembly broke up into
four courses of leadership training.
Mr. Victor Walecka, Highwood, and
James Russell of Deerfield each led
a group of about 25 men each in the
Elements of Scoutmastership course.
Mr. D. F. Whitelaw Jr. of the Chi-
cago, North Shore and Milwaukee
railroad, directed the first aid course
of about 30 men. Mr. Robert Roe-
ber of Lake Forest conducted the
Principles of Scoutmastership course
and James R. Goetz of Winnetka led
the Commissioners course.

The fine turnout for the university
was due to the efforts of the coun-
cil's commissioner's staff, headed by
James R. Goetz. Each district com-
missioner worked up the attendance
in their district and as a result
each district had a good representa-
tion.
