## HIGHWAY POLICE TO ENFORCE TRUCK LAW

#### Statute Provides of Lights and Reflectors on Vehicles; Description

State highway patrolmen in the Lake county district will start making arrests November 1 for violations of the new state law on truck lights and reflectors, State Police Officer Harry Quandt announced today.

Although the new law has been in effect since October 1, Walter L. Moody, superintendent of the state police has decided to make October an "educational" period, during which time truck owners and drivers may acquaint themselves with the new regulations.

#### Must Carry Reflectors

"Trucks and trailers which exceed 20 feet in length are required to carry reflectors, as specified by the law," Patrolman Quandt pointed out. If trucks or trailers, either of them or combined, exceed 25 feet in length, then in addition to the reflectors they are required to carry red lights in the rear and green lights in the front.

In placing these lights the red ones in the rear, as provided in the body of the law, must be placed at the top of the truck body. In some instances the truck have no such top, and it will be necessary that the lights be placed on the rear of the bed of the truck.

#### Serve As Warning

According to an opinion rendered by the attorney general, the side reflectors are to be attached to the sides of the trucks and trailers in a lateral position, flat against the sides. They are to serve the purpose of a warning to motor vehicles approaching the truck or trailer from an intersection of the street or from a side road.

## Natural Gas To Be in Mains of Public Service This Week, Reported

Communities on the north shore served by the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois, will probably receive their first supply of natural gas this week, according to an announcement made from the general offices of the company in Chicago. The gas will be pumped from the Texas-Arkansas fields.

The new rates ordered by the Illinois Commerce Commission after recent hearings went into effect last week throughout the inland territory served by the company. The use of natural gas will mean a saving of from 5 to 30 per cent for cooking and heating use compared with a possible 3 per cent cut as originally intended for cooking. The saving will vary according to the use of the gas.

## West Lake County Towns Banded to Fight New Gas Rate

Twenty-two towns and villages, including a number in western Lake county, were banded together last week to fight for lower gas rates when natural gas is pumped to this vicinity from Texas oil fields. Representatives from the villages

agreed that they should hire one attorney to represent the entire group and to assess each municipality on a per capita basis. The recently announced gas rate reductions are not large enough, representatives said.

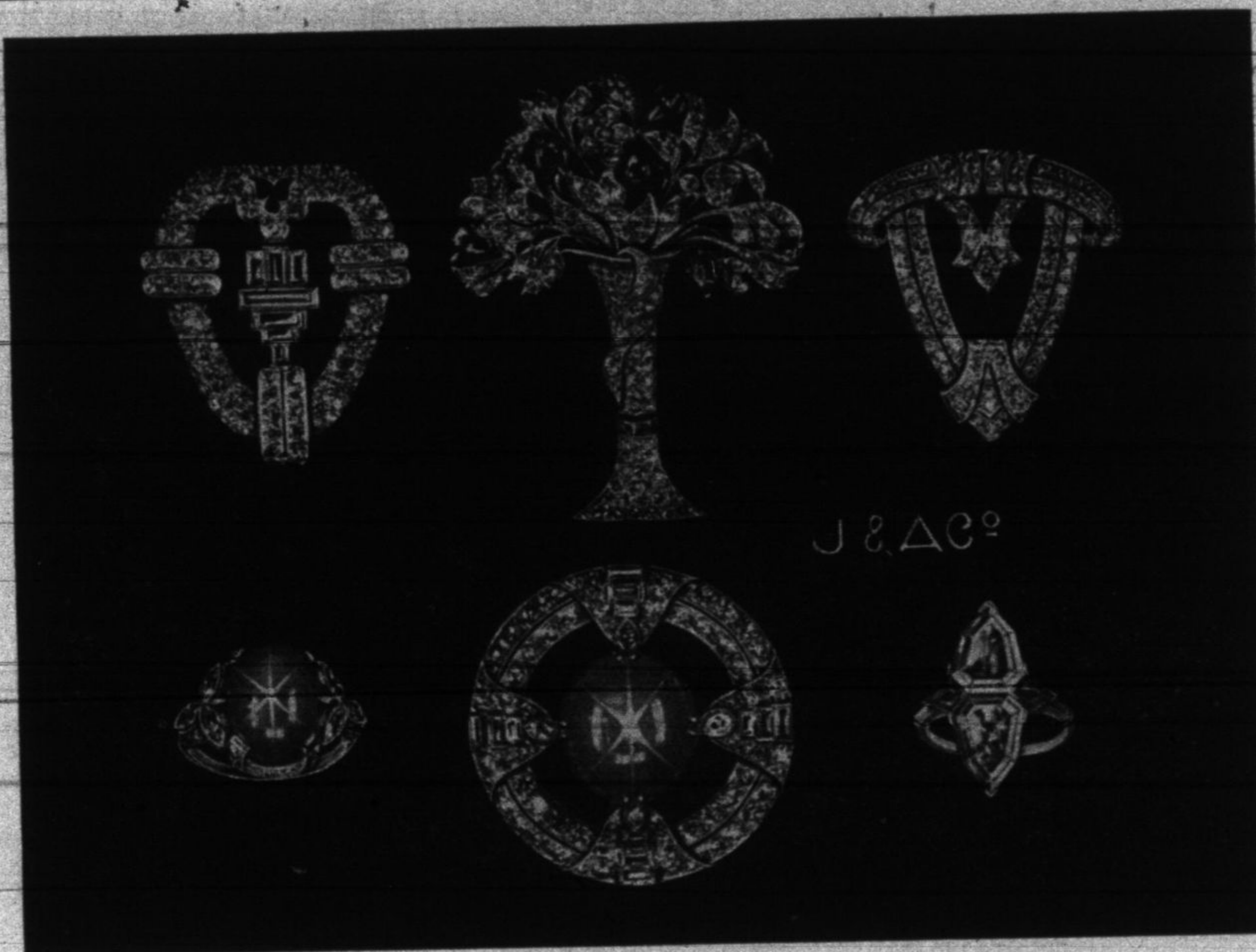
