Breeders' and exhibitors' awards in the Holsteins went to the Elmwood Farm, Deerfield, Ill., and the junior champion is Sir Hobes Ormsby Hazelwood of the Elmwood farm. King Bessie Korndyle Ormsby, also from the Elmwood farm, was adjudged the best bull in the 2-to-3-year old class.

since the schools need the support and co-operation of the community, in order to progress, the Parent-Teacher associations have felt that they could greatly assist by keeping the community in touch with general progressive movements in education.

Such is the idea back of the Rugg lecture offered next Thursday night.

Here Three Years Ago

Many teachers and parents have still a vivid memory of the lecture given by Mr. Rugg at Elm Place school three years ago. Several of the schools have been using his Social Science pamphlets, and teachers and parents alike have found his recent books "The Child Centered School," and "Culture and Education in America," not only interesting, but positively thrilling in the prospect of human development which he unfolds.

Take for instance in "Culture and Education in America," his chapter on the school-centered community. Let us quote a sentence or two, and see if it does not send you to the book for a new picture of our community.

Must Be Co-ordinated

"Our conception must be of a co-ordinated system of adult and child education reaching actively into every phase of community life. . . . We should concern of a planned unified educational system integrating all the social agencies of the community at every age level from infancy to old age."

And here is a new picture of boards of education. "Thus the superintendent of education and his board of education would constitute a planning, thinking body, and only incidentally an administration body. Far from being a political or an economic and social gang, as it is so frequently today, it would be a discussion group. Its meetings would constitute open forums, attended by all interested members of the community."

The German and French premiers had a very satisfactory meeting in Berlin and we sincerely hope they didn't spend too much time whetting their political knives for their proposed visits to the United States.
