

WILL PLACE ACTS BEFORE LEGISLATURE

Bonehead Legislation of Last Session to Be Taken Up at Special

Steps to remove the problem presented by the enactment of the Finn pauper act will be taken at the special session of the general assembly. Governor Louis L. Emmerson last week promised Representative Richard J. Lyons, of Mundelein.

The agreement to include the pauper problem was obtained last week by Lyons after a conference with the chief executive who had taken the position that only matters pertaining to the revenue act should be on the special call which is expected to open on or before November 10.

Shifted Burden

The Finn amendment to the original act shifted the burden of pauper aid from the county to the townships in the county. Waukegan township, through the change, was faced with a possible expenditure of \$80,000 which would include poor keep, patients sent to the county hospitals and charges to the county farm at Libertyville. This financial burden once was prorated in taxes to the entire county.

If the townships had been in a position to make a levy and raise funds for these purposes the situation would not have been so acute, county officials explain, but the law would not permit a levy and delayed the time for the collection of

any money to defray these expenses for more than a year.

Using Script

During this crisis the township supervisors, especially in Waukegan, have been using a form of script to meet the bills which have been cut to emergency hospital cases and medicine for the pauper sick. In this Supervisor Matt P. Dilger issues a form of a tax anticipation warrant to the creditor of the county and stamps it "no funds." These must be carried by the receiver until cash is available under a levy.

Gov. Emmerson told Lyons that he had no plans for a relief amendment but that he would entertain any logical solutions from any member of the two houses of the assembly.

County and town officials were elated at the success of Lyons in getting permission to submit the problem to the lower house.
