**Federal Officers in
Raid Find Still Near
Lake Zurich, Reported**

Another Lake county still was located and confiscated last week but this time the raid was staged by federal prohibition agents.

The wildcat distillery was found in operation at a farmhouse a mile north of Lake Zurich and agents reported that it had a 350 gallon capacity.

The agents, led by A. E. Hamilton, made two arrest. The victims, August Hauck and Rossi Crasti, were taken to Chicago where they are to be arraigned today before United States Commissioner Edwin K. Walker.

There have been more than a dozen wildcat breweries and alcohol plants uncovered in the county in the past six months by the sheriff, states attorney and government.

**How Envelope Racket
Was Played on Two
Waukegan Firms, Told**

Two business concerns were victimized by a man operating the "envelope game" recently in Waukegan.

Miss Katherine M. Kelly, bookkeeper at the Washington Laundry, reported to police at 5:45 o'clock Saturday that a man had worked the envelope game successfully at the laundry and obtained \$20. The second case was reported at 7:15 o'clock by the Singer Sewing Machine company, 134 North Genesee street, when a man obtained a similar amount.

The man operating the game in both cases was described similarly by the victims and it is believed that one man was successful in victimizing both concerns.

Miss Kelly reported that the man asked her for 20 \$1 bills, saying he wanted to send the money away and produced an addressed envelope. Miss Kelly gave him the \$20 bill and when she counted the ones found them to total only 19. In the meantime the man had sealed the envelope supposedly enclosing the \$20 bill.

The man took his 19 \$1 bills back, saying he would go get another and left the sealed envelope in which he was supposed to have put the \$20 bill. After the man left the envelope was opened and found to contain only a \$1 bill, two envelopes being used by the man who was evidently a veteran at the old envelope game.

**Doolittle May Be
Coroner Candidate**

Lawrence Doolittle, former sheriff, will be a Republican candidate for county coroner in the spring, as well as Edward Conrad, deputy county coroner for years.

Dr. John L. Taylor, coroner for close to 30 years, is expected to ask for re-election.

Doolittle has been considering running for the office for more than a year. Even before he relinquished his duties at the sheriff's office he expressed a preference for coroner over all other political posts.

Since his retirement almost a year ago Doolittle has spent his time improving his property at Birchwood, Wis., where he has considerable land on a lake.
