FROM LAKE COUNTY**

**Interesting Happenings About
This Part of North Shore;
County Seat**

The Illinois Municipal League held its eighteenth annual state convention in Waukegan last week, with the largest attendance in its history.

George Liebegood, 19-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. George Liebegood of Wauconda, was fatally injured when he dashed out into the street at Wauconda and was struck by an automobile.

Nine new aldermen, and possibly ten, will have to be elected in the spring to fill out the new Waukegan city administration, a survey of the political prospects disclosed.

Pong Wing Soon, Chinese, is in the custody of Lake county authorities to serve a six months sentence. He is the first of his race to be committed to the Lake county jail in the memory of present officers.

Attorney J. A. Miller, newly appointed counsel to Fred Brown Whitney, receiver of the Waukegan State bank, last week assumed his official capacity and held a conference with Whitney regarding to his plans for litigation in liquidating the bank.

Mrs. John Dunn, 67, mother of Edward Dunn, of Wauconda, deputy sheriff under Lawrence Doolittle, died recently in St. Joseph's hospital in Elgin where she had been taken several days ago from her home in Cary for an operation.

James G. Welch, candidate for the Democratic congressional nomination was named president of the Lake County Democratic club in a regular monthly meeting of the group held last week.

Changes of venue from the county were asked by attorneys for Oscar Nelson, state auditor of public accounts, and Norman O. Geyer, president of the defunct Waukegan State bank, before Circuit Judge Ralph J. Dady.

Dr. Albert E. Brown, for a decade county physician, and the superintendent of the Lake County General hospital when it was built from a minor emergency institution to its present size, died last week at his home in Pasadena, Cal.

Formation of a new Taxpayers' party was effected officially last week when a group of ardent enthusiasts from Lake and McHenry counties met at the Karcher hotel, Waukegan, and proclaimed a third party with equalization of taxation as the keynote.

**Boxing Elimination

L. McDonough, chairman of the organization has decided to hold an elimination. This will take place Thursday night, October 29, at the Deerfield Grammar school.

All boys entered or those who wish to enter are requested to be at the school at 7 p.m. for medical ex-

amination, weighing in and matching. The bouts will begin about 7:30 p.m. The general public is invited to attend. An admission fee will be collected at the door.

Packey McFarland former light-weight champion and a group of Chicago fighters will be on hand to referee the fights and match the boys. Tickets are on sale for the finals at the Waukegan high school on November 9. The entire proceeds of these shows go to charity.
