

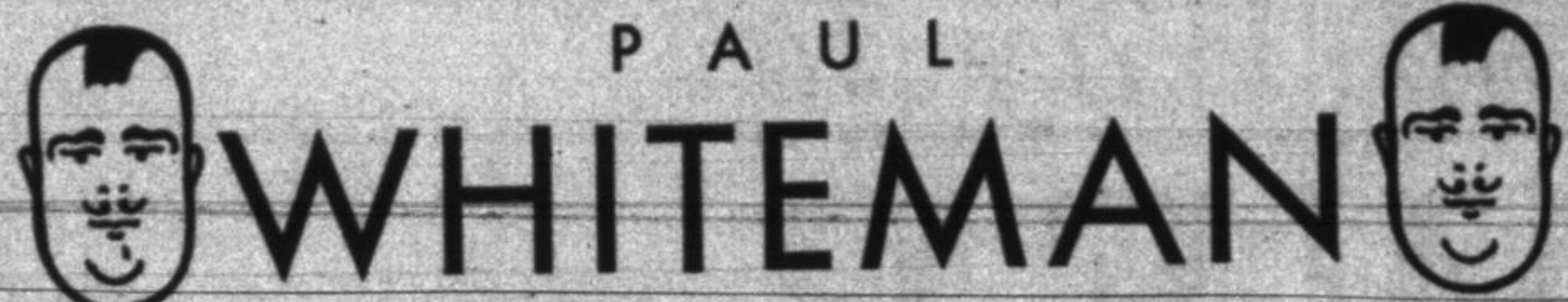

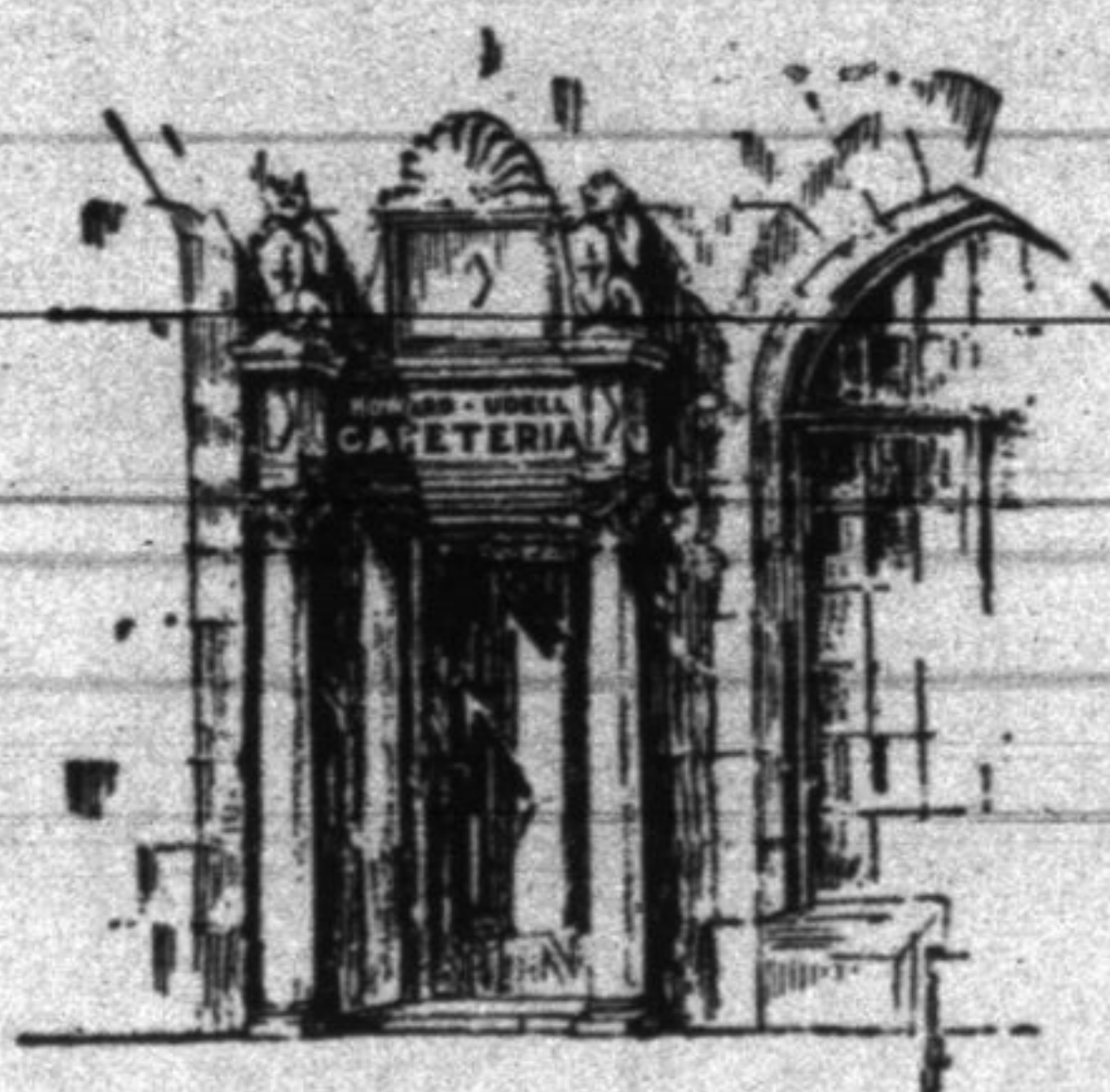

**LEAGUE COMMITTEE MEETING IS HELD**

Membership Drive Progress Reported Oct. 23; Quote Talk by Cermak

The Organization and Membership committee of the League of Women Voters met at Mrs. Wilson Kline's, 520 Hawthorn lane, at 10 o'clock Friday morning, October 23, to report on the progress of the membership drive. More and more women are finding it necessary to be informed on the political and economic affairs of the country. Especially in such critical times as these is it important to be intelligent in regard to the causes that have led up to the present lack of employment, and economic depression and what is being done for its relief. Mayor Cermak, in a radio speech not long ago made this special appeal to women to take a more serious and active interest in public affairs.

**Urges Use of Ballot**

"You are no longer passive participants in municipal and county governments. The right to cast the ballot requires you to make intelligent use of that ballot. It further requires you to take your place as citizens alongside of the men. Your duties and responsibilities do not end with election day.

"Women pay taxes because they own property. Therefore they should be interested in the question of taxation and in the operations of our taxing bodies.

"Women are the mothers of children who attend our public institutions for the education of the young. Therefore they are vitally concerned about the conduct of our city board of education and the management of our suburban and county schools.

"Again, women have children who play in our public parks and playgrounds. They and their husbands take advantage of the magnificent county parks known as the forest preserves. Therefore they are interested in the various official organizations that operate and control these public recreation centers.

"Women drive automobiles and are therefore interested in the condition of our streets and alleys.

"With these thoughts in mind, I am therefore appealing to young women to take a more personal and direct interest in the operation of our city and county governments. We welcome your comments and constructive criticisms."

**Favors Employment Officers**

In the present period of depression everyone is naturally looking to government to help find methods to relieve the situation. The Illinois League of Women Voters believes that one way in which governmental agencies can contribute toward a solution of some of our problems is by an effectively coordinated system of federal and state employment offices.

Miss Mollie Ray Carroll of the University of Chicago, chairman of the Women in Industry committee of the Illinois League of Women Voters, has made some very valuable suggestions for a brief survey of employment in towns throughout the state. She asks such questions as: When employers want labor how do they get it,—advertise in the newspapers, hang out a sign?

What employment agencies are there in your community and what kinds of workers do they take care of? What kind of workers do they not handle?"

The 1930 census shows that women constitute 22 per cent, almost one-fourth, of those employed in the United States. The most experienced employment service administrative recognize that special provision needs to be made for women applicants in placement offices in order to win their confidence and that special study must be given to find the increasing industrial opportunities which are opening for them. To insure the adequate consideration this special phase of employment service requires, it is important that in organizing the federal and state service due provision be made for serving the large group of women workers.
