Northwestern Grid Team Plays Illinois at Evanston Saturday

Northwestern's football team moves into the last half of its schedule when it resumes its annual rivalry with the University of Illinois at Dycbe stadium, at Evanston, Saturday. In the first four games, the Wildcats won three and tied one, the latter being a 0 to 0 clash with Notre Dame.

Recent reverses suffered by Illinois have in no wise lessened the respect held for them in the Wildcat camp. Coach Dick Hanley is not the type of coach to permit his charges to wax over confident, especially when a team with the reputation of the fighting Illini is in the offing. The Wildcat mentor recalls too well some of the nip-and-tuck battles waged with Coach Bob Zuppke's warriors to take Saturday's game lightly.

The annual series between Northwestern and Illinois have been productive of some of the hardest fought gridiron engagements in Big Ten football. Since Coach Hanley took over the reins at Northwestern in 1927, the teams have met annually. In '27 the score was 7 to 6 in favor of Illinois. The following year the Illini again won, this time 6 to 0. Northwestern was victor in 1929, 7 to 0 and last year swept aside an inexperienced Illinois team, 32 to 0.

Victory over Ohio last Saturday has stirred the championship ambition among the Wildcats, and they will be intent upon adding Illinois to their list of victims this week-end. On the other hand Coach Zuppke has freely predicted that his team will figure in one major upset this season and it is no secret that the Wiley Dutchman would like nothing better than to make this prophecy come true at the expense of the Wildcats.
