DEERFIELDS-SHIELDS TO MEET EVANSTON ON NOVEMBER 7TH

Both Teams Prepared, Blue Backs Seek Revenge

HOME COMING GAME

On Saturday, November 7, a hefty, strong, and powerful Evanston eleven will wend its way to the Deerfield athletic field to engage in a Suburban league tilt which is the next to the last for each team, and which marks Deerfield's home-coming.

Not only will the athletic field be the scene of a grid battle, but the Suburban League cross-country track meet will also take place, this between the halves of the big game.

Oak Park Beats Evanston

Though not rubbing it in, Oak Park is the only team thus far to defeat Evanston. Evanston has taken Proviso, Morton, lost to Oak Park, will either win or lose from or to Deerfield-Shields, and still have New Trier to play.

Outside of the league, Evanston has defeated Senn, Thornton, and La Grange. These, all decisive victories, mean that Evanston is a plenty good team.

With such men as, Haines, Kein (last year's all suburban back), Jackson, and Heblom playing at positions in the wildkit backfield, backed up by a strong and powerful line, it's going to be a hard job putting anything over on them.

The line, which averages around 185 pounds, is going to be an exact resemblance of a stone wall to go through. With Case and Minto at ends, Rudolph and Johnston, or Meyers will have their hands full taking care of them. Both of the wildkits' ends are tall, heavy, and fast, with a tendency to catch passes and get in around the opposing end to mess up plays.

With Chuck Siddall and Stewart at tackles, things are going to be that much harder. Charley Siddall, especially, weighs over 200 pounds, and as stated in a previous issue, is heavy enough to crush a bear. Any person with a picture of a massive, slow moving, ferocious football player as an image of "Chuck" is going to be sadly disillusioned. That boy is made up of bone, gristle, and muscle, and in spite of his weight, he is tall enough to carry it without any bother, and if you think he's slow, try running a quarter with him.

"Aub" Whittemore and Sievers, two excellent blocking, and crushing guards, flank Sam Whiteside at center. Sam is the boy who's going to be all tired out when Freddy Fell gets through with him, though that doesn't mean that Sam isn't any good, because he is.

Play to Win

Now there are about a hundred reasons why we ought to win, and these are all reasons that have nothing to do with the strength of the teams, how good each team is, or the fact that either team is stronger than the other.

Two years ago, the good old wildkits came to Deerfield and returned as kittens, and not wild either. The

bluebacks, feeling ambitious, had taken the "kits" 33 to 12.

Evanston, taking this defeat much to heart, met the bluebacks at their athletic field, sometime last fall. The less said the better. The kittens got wild, and lived up to the name "Wildkits" by fighting Deerfield to a score of about 54 to 0. That's one reason. Another is that it's Deerfield's turn to win, and the third, a reply to the sarcastic remarks that "The Evanstonian" has been printing about the boys in blue and white.

Another factor not to be forgotten is that November 7 is homecoming day for Deerfield. Therefore, a crowd is needed to make the day a success and to route the "pigskin-

ners" along to victory. It also takes a big crowd to make itself heard at the other end of the field, when the cross country men do their hiking.

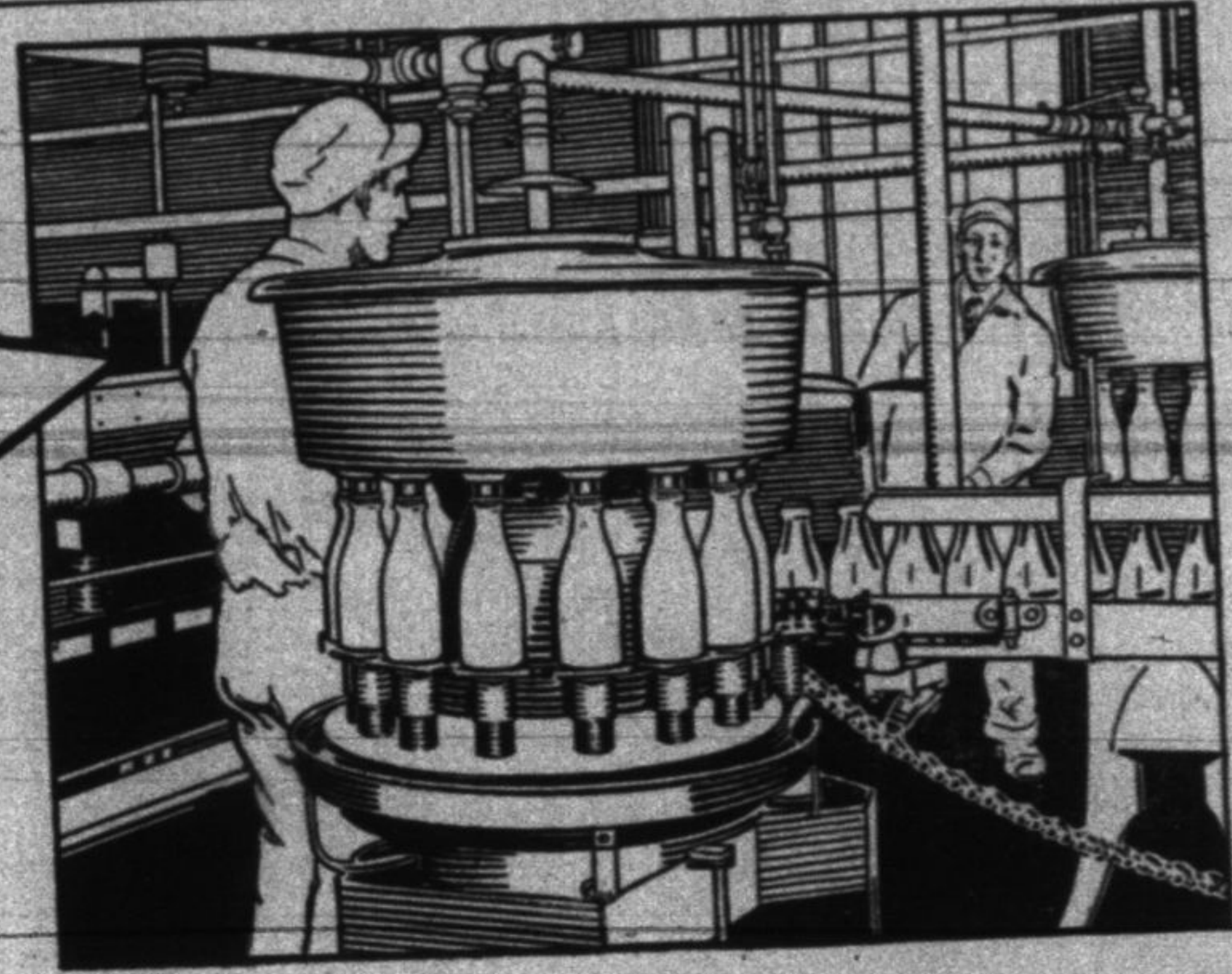

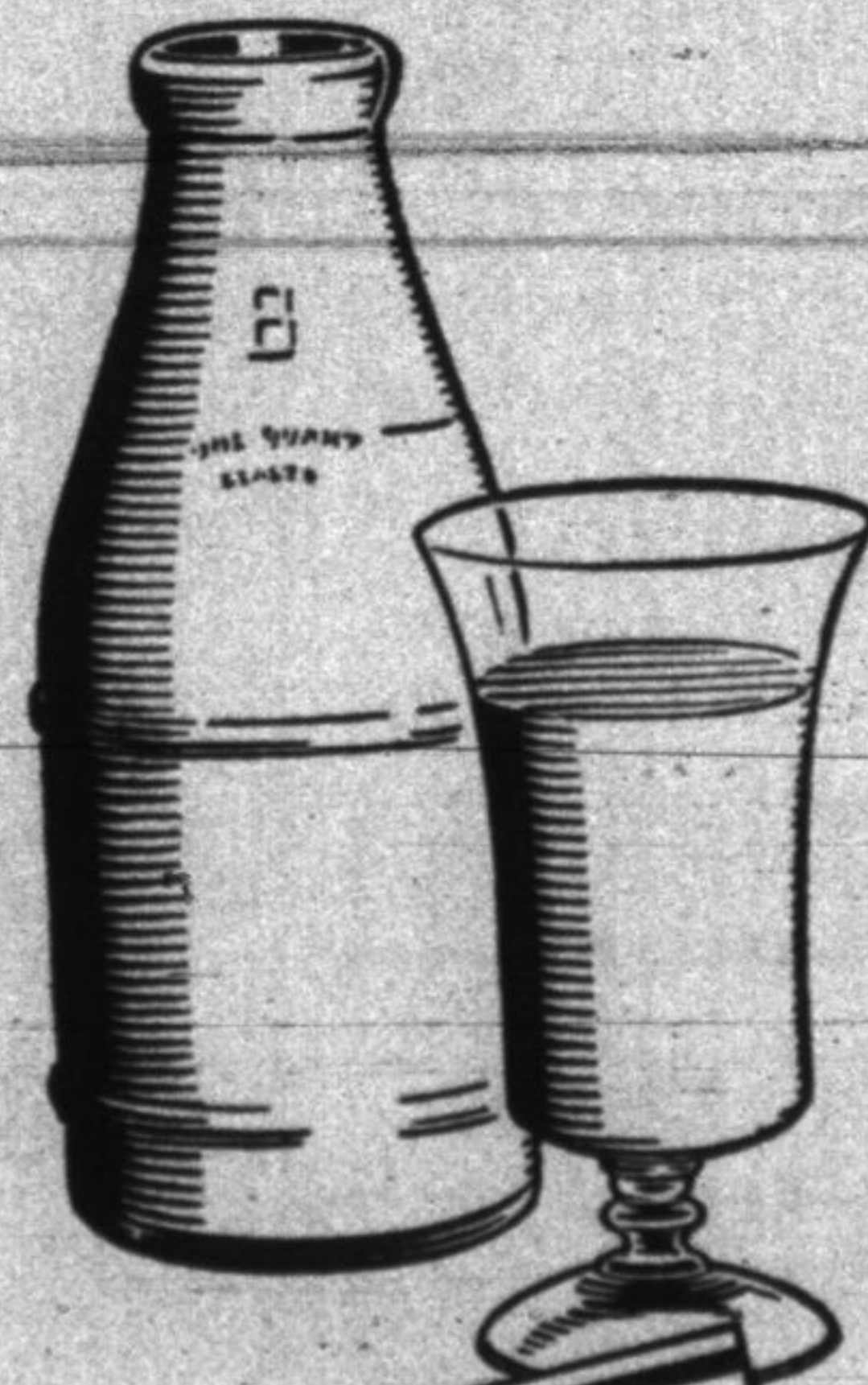
