A Bit O' Books

"When the train stops at stations in the different states of Mexico, it

is like stopping in the middle of a fair. Women in blue rebozos and men in big peaked straw hats crowd up to the car windows to sell their wares — while cheese on green leaves, butter wrapped in cornhusks, enchiladas, tortillas, oranges, chicozapotes, chicken, coffee, cakes, and candy. And always above the cries of all the other station vendors you hear the seller of toys alling: 'Juguetes, juguetes!' For toys are a part of every market and are among the most delightful things made in Mexico." This is what we find in a perfectly charming book on Mexico, its art, legends, and customs. "Made in Mexico" by Susan Smith is just the right size for boys and girls, not too large, not too thick, and it does have most interesting sketches in black and white.

Her first book, "Made in America" is even more interesting, for it tells us about "Paul Revere Silversmith," "Thomas Jefferson, the first American architect," "Currier and Ives" and others. Listen to this interesting bit on Paul Revere:

"Paul Revere loved a little excitement, and on that Lexington ride he thoroughly enjoyed himself, galloping up to the dark farmhouses and banging on the doors with his crop until nightcapped heads appeared at the windows. He wrote about it: 'I went home, took my boots and surtout, went to the north part of the town where I kept a boat; two friends rowed me across the Charles river. The flood and the moon was rising.

I set off on a very good horse, it was then about eleven and very pleasant.'" Isn't it interesting to know that this patriot was such a fine silversmith? "All of his work in precious metals was classic and beautiful, and museums are proud when they can label their finest old silver 'Made by Paul Revere'."
