

MAY BRING SUIT IN SALARY MATTER

Injunction Threatened to Prevent Payment to County Road Engineer

Formal demand that suit be brought in court to recover from R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways of Lake county, the sum of \$7,500, received by him as alleged excess salary during the last three years, is to be made in the form of a resolution which will be presented to the Lake county board of supervisors at their December meeting by Assistant Supervisor C. O. Jones, according to a statement made today by Mr. Jones.

The salary of Lobdell, as it appears upon the county record, is \$4,500 a year. For the last three years now the county board has been paying him an additional salary of \$2,500 a year, making a total of \$7,000 yearly. This additional salary has been paid from engineering and maintenance fund.

Fix Salary at \$7,000

At the September meeting the board voted to fix Lobdell's salary at \$7,000 a year. Some protest about the legality of such a course was raised at the time but the resolution of the finance committee calling for the change, was adopted.

Because of the doubt that had arisen States Attorney A. V. Smith immediately wrote to Attorney General Oscar Carlstrom, asking for an opinion. In this opinion, received last week, Carlstrom took the position that the board had exceeded its authority by increasing the salary of an official during his incumbency. He held also that the salary of such an official must come out of the gen-

eral fund and added that to take part of his remuneration from another fund was illegal, even if the salary increase were legal.

Northwestern Railroad Adds Weekly Commuters Ticket, Starting Nov. 2

A new member was added to the Chicago and North Western railway's commutation ticket family Monday, November 2, when 12-ride weekly individual tickets were placed on sale; and this newest member introduces a novel departure from its 25, 10 and monthly ride brothers and sisters—the option to purchase additional suburban rides on the same division at a two-cent a mile rate up to 50 per cent of the total mileage represented by the 12 rides on the ticket, C. A. Cairns, passenger traffic manager of the North Western, announced.

"This new ticket will appeal to patrons because of its low per-ride rate and because of this additional option," Mr. Cairns believes. "It

is priced lower than the 25 and 10 ride tickets and only slightly higher than the 60-ride monthly individual tickets.
