CHINESE SUPPER AND BAZAAR NOVEMBER 20

Given Under Auspices of Pres-
byterian Guild; Chinese
Church Co-Operating

The Chinese supper and bazaar which the Highland Park Presbyterian Guild is holding on Friday, Nov. 20, will do more than give this community an interesting and profitable good time. It will promote good fellowship between the people of this neighborhood and the Chinese Christian church of Chicago. The latter is the only Christian church of its kind in the middle west. The Rev. Cham is very desirous of such a feeling of co-operation and is making several visits to this church during that week in order to see that the decorations and Chinese scrolls are hung in proper sequence. Having been a merchant previous to becoming a Christian pastor he helped select the articles to be sold at the bazaar, which will be open during the afternoon and evening, thus assuring proper prices and a selection suitable to the tastes of our community. It is his desire to have the undertaking satisfactory in every way to the people of Highland Park and surrounding territory.

Bazaar

Rev. Cham is bringing out many manuscripts, color prints and scrolls of his own with which to decorate the parish house. One of the latter was written by an emperor one hundred and seventy years ago. Among the articles on sale will be Chinese character dolls, pottery, trays, tea sets, and linens. You may buy such eatables as tea, ginger, candied fruits, nuts, fried noodles, almond cookies and candy, all distinctively Chinese. Several Chinese women will assist with the selling at the various booths in the parish house which will be turned into an oriental shop.

Supper

A chop suey supper with rice, tea, rolls, and almond cakes will be served from 5:30 to 7:30. Women from their church will cook and serve the dinner, thus assuring home-cooked food. Children under twelve may use a half-priced ticket. One of the Guild members will take care of very small children and if you wish they may bring their own supper with them to eat while you are enjoying chop suey.

The Presbyterian Guild wishes the hearty co-operation of every one to make this project a success. Their share of the proceeds will go to the support of Laird Community house in Chicago. 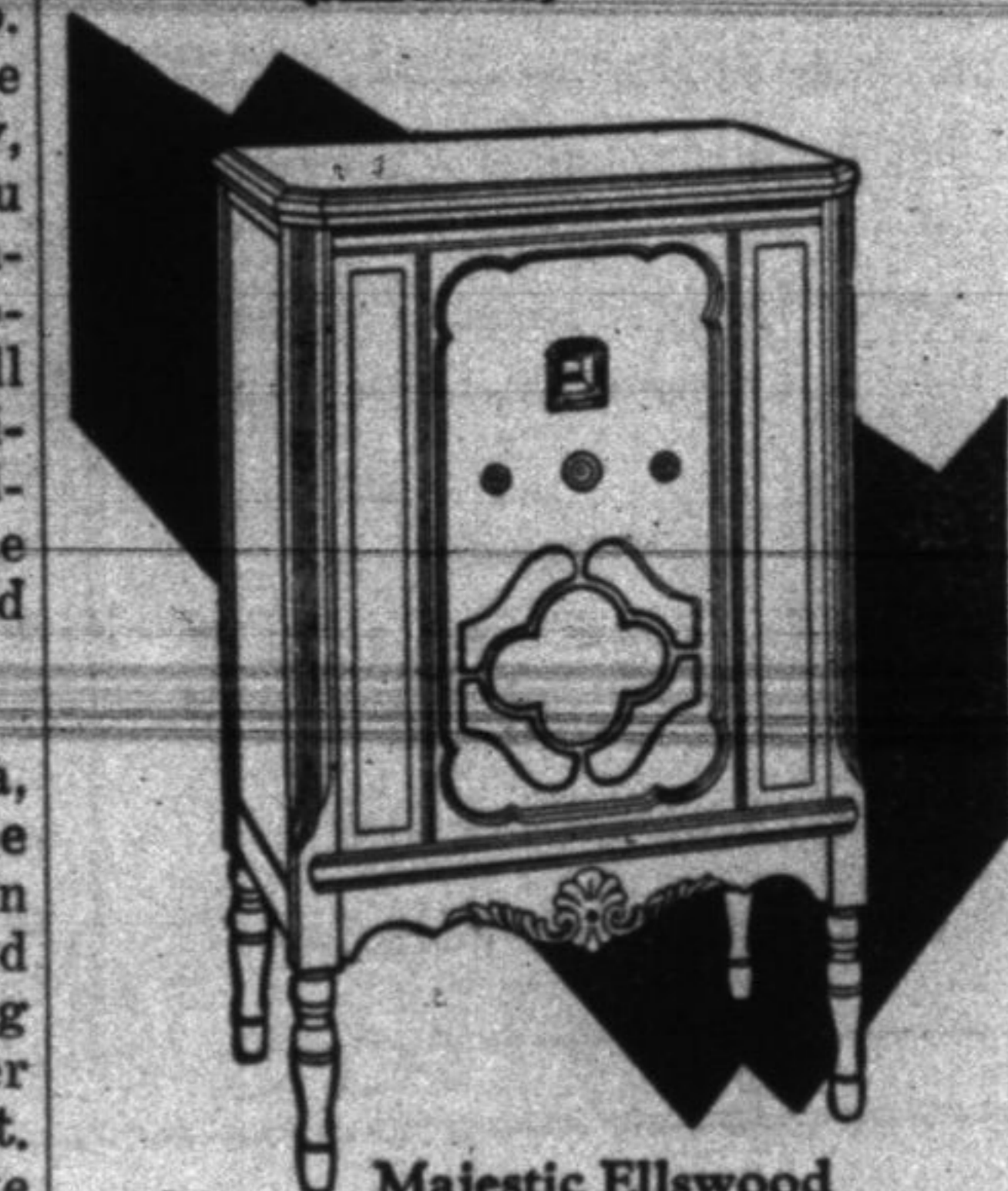
