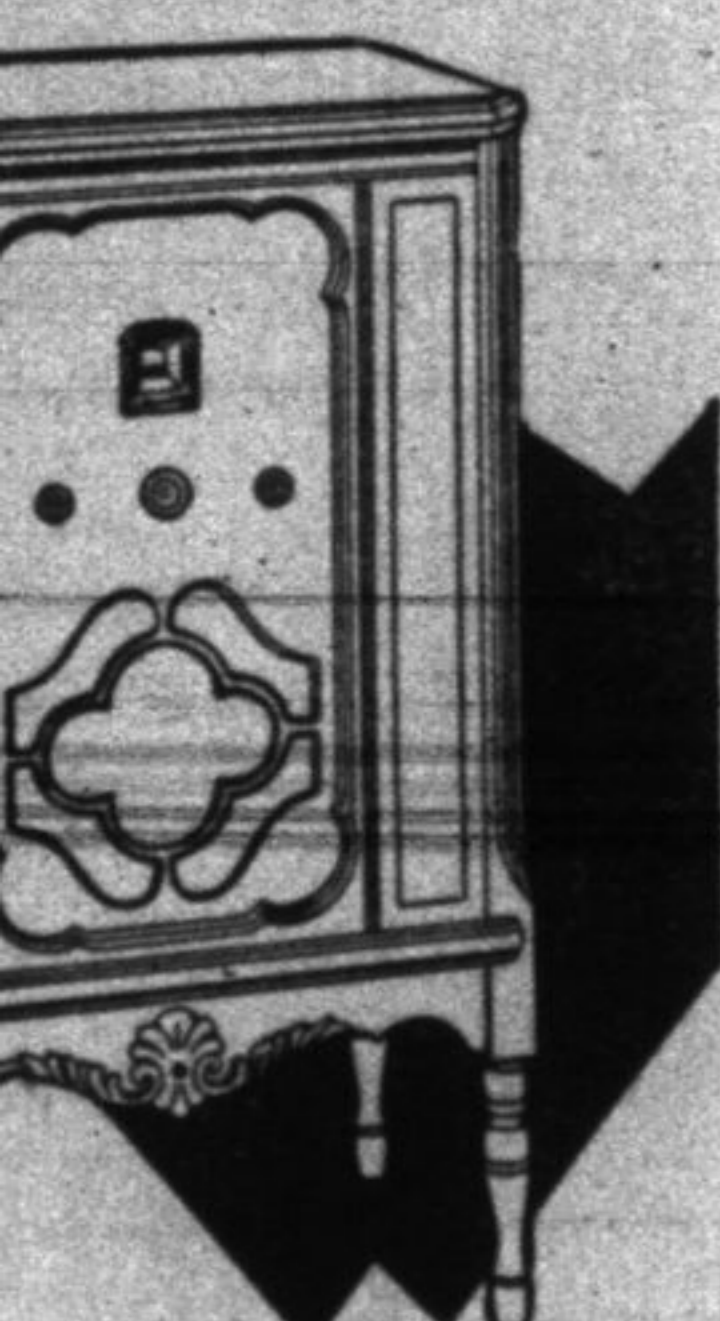

to remain on the Elks seven yard line after two plunges failed to gain but the problem was solved when a pass from Francis sailed over the goal line to nestle safely in the arms of Bock for a touchdown. Francis' drop kick for the extra point was short.

The Elks put on their act in the next quarter. It all came about when they intercepted a widely thrown Press pass. The receiver running all the way to the Press 10 yard line before he was downed. Three tries at the line and the Press line didn't bulge an inch; but on the last desperate attempt, a pass was completed for a touchdown; and not only that but the place kick for the extra point was good.

That point looked like a million before Parker did his stuff. Tilly Martin who was mainly responsible for the accumulation of first downs for the Press, started the ball rolling in that final drive. Taking a punt on his 10 yard line he ran it back 20 yards to the 30 yard mark. On the next he circled left end for 15 more. Then a substitution was made. Parker going in for Bartleman. The first play Parker cut through right tackle and wasn't stopped till he was thrown out on the Elks 25 yard line. It was Martins turn next as he again circled right end till the 12 yard line. Parker then plunged till the one yard line and on the next play smashed over for the winning goal.

### Many Injuries

Injuries crept in to hamper the local lads again. Tom Rogan had to leave the game after the first few minutes because of a bad hip. Burt Berube was on the side lines throughout the game, and Bud Moon who was seriously hurt in an automobile accident is in the hospital. These boys are under the supervision of Dr. Banfield, the teams physician.
