IMPORTANT NOTICE on GAS RATES

*Proposed Plan will SAVE
residential customers of the*

NORTH SHORE GAS COMPANY

*2% on bills for domestic gas service
10% on bills for gas home heating service*

Every residential customer of the North Shore Gas Company will benefit from the rate reductions which have been proposed in two classes of gas service. Immediate approval of the Illinois Commerce Commission will be requested on the proposed rates as soon as the various municipalities served have expressed concurrence with the proposed reduction. These reductions will be made on the basis of present manufactured gas service. There will be no change in the quality or kind of gas the company is serving.

Substantial savings will be made by customers in gas used for all domestic gas appliances, including ranges, water heaters, room heaters, incinerators, clothes dryers, ironers and refrigerators; and in gas used in gas home heating

plants. Customers will make a saving of approximately two per cent (2%) in gas used in the operation of all domestic appliances, and ten per cent (10%) in all gas used for gas heating plants.

The proposed rate reduction is a desire of the North Shore Gas Company to bring some immediate economies to its customers. The savings customers will effect, the company feels, will, in a measure, help lessen financial burdens which may be particularly heavy due to current conditions. The reduced rate plan is offered with this view in mind; and for the reason that adjoining companies, now serving a mixed natural and artificial gas, already have acted in reducing rates.

A natural gas supply is not yet avail-

able to the North Shore Gas Company. Negotiations with the pipe line company have been underway for a considerable time, but that company has not, as yet, begun construction of a line to serve the North Shore Gas Company's territory. The pipe line company has stated, however, that such a line will be constructed during 1932. Until such time as a definite decision is forthcoming on the actual time for the building of this line, negotiations will continue.

When a natural gas supply is secured, the North Shore Gas Company will make all possible revisions in its rate structures for the benefit of its customers. To that end, the company is making a careful study of all factors entering that problem.
