North Shore Gas Company will benefit from the rate reductions which have been proposed in two classes of gas service. Immediate approval of the Illinois Commerce Commission will be requested on the proposed rates as soon as the various municipalities served have expressed concurrence with the proposed reduction. These reductions will be made on the basis of present manufactured gas service. There will be no change in the quality or kind of gas the company is serving.

Substantial savings will be made by customers in gas used for all domestic gas appliances, including ranges, water heaters, room heaters, incinerators, clothes dryers, ironers and refrigerators; and in gas used in gas home heating

The proposed rate reduction is a desire of the North Shore Gas Company to bring some immediate economies to its customers.
