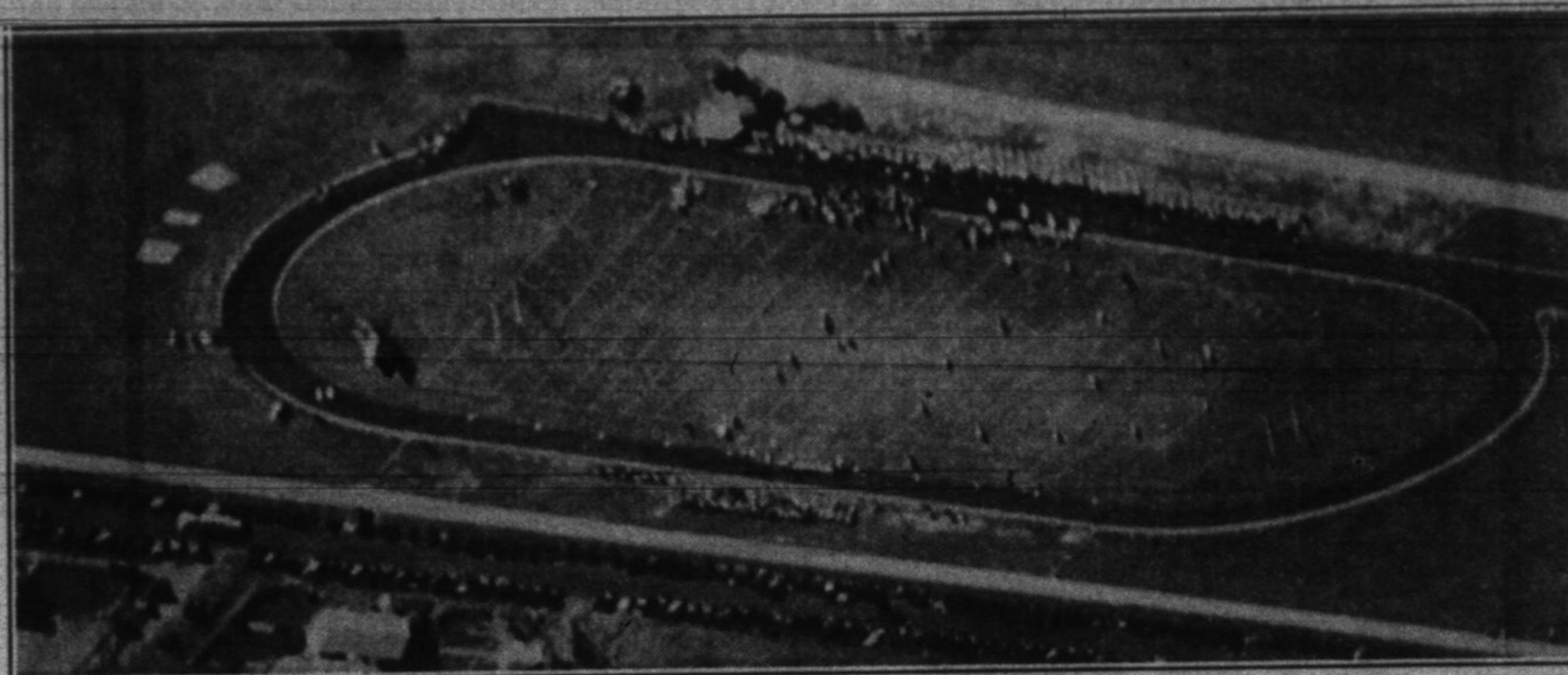


AERIAL VIEW OF DEERFIELD-SHIELDS ATHLETIC FIELD

Though Evanston and New Trier are still to play their deciding game, the rest of the Suburban league teams have written "finis" to their football careers for this year, and are now turning to basketball.

As stated before, New Trier and Evanston are to scrap at Dyche stadium, and what a game that's going to be. Two evenly matched teams which are incidentally traditional enemies, will both be fighting to keep from being shoved into third place.

Oak Park Powerful

That Oak Park has a strong and powerful team shown by the winning of all her games by a big margin. Of all the teams playing against Oak Park, Deerfield made the best showing, losing by a score of 12 to 6. Evanston lost 25 to 13, Morton went down to defeat 33 to 0, New Trier lost 13 to 6, and Proviso was defeated 34 to 7.

It appears that scores of games make little difference, Oak Park defeated Evanston by a bigger score

than Deerfield, but Evanston took the Bluebacks 25 to 13. New Trier lost to Oak Park by a 13 to 6 score, and Deerfield lost 12 to 6, but New Trier won from Deerfield 19 to 0.

Sheriff to Enforce Aeronautics Law in Lake County, Report

Strict enforcement of the state aeronautics law, passed by the legislature at the last session, will be made by Sheriff Lester Tiffany and the municipal police in Lake county, it was revealed last week in a letter received by the sheriff from Reed G. Landis, chairman of the Illinois Aeronautics Commission.

"It shall be the duty of every county and municipal officer to enforce and assist in the enforcement of this act," the state aviation law provides.
