 FROM LAKE COUNTY**

**Happenings About This Part
 of North Shore; Doings at
 County Seat**

Plans for an extensive water and rail shipping terminal point in connection with the Waukegan harbor, to cost several millions of dollars, has been unfolded to Waukegan city officials, by A. E. Rogers, president of the Elgin, Joliet and Eastern railroad, according to Waukegan papers.

Two Zion residents narrowly escaped instant death and their home was destroyed in a \$12,000 fire last week when a gasoline tank exploded in the basement of the residence while the tank was being filled.

Pasteurization of all milk to be sold in the city is provided for in an ordinance presented at a meeting of the Waukegan city council at the request of the health department.

Capt. Bruce Bairnsfather, former allied army cartoonist and ex-British army officer, last week entertained a crowd of nearly two hundred and fifty at the Waukegan Y. M. C. A. with his illustrated lecture "From Mud to Mufti."

William E. Sayle, 27 years a resident of Waukegan and an employe of the U. S. Envelope company a like number of years, died at his home in that city last week, after an illness of five years.

At the conclusion of four days of intensive solicitation last week, by about 200 men and women of Waukegan, the city's emergency relief fund had expanded to \$78,852, \$26,852 more than the original quota of \$48,000.

Yielding to the request of Waukegan Third Ward Democrats, Attorney James G. Welch last week agreed at a Democratic meeting in that city to re-enter the race for congress. Welch, earlier in the week, had said that lack of finances would keep him from the campaign, it was said.

Installation of automatic gates to replace the manual operated apparatus at the Grand avenue and Ridgeland avenue crossings of the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee railroad in Waukegan, was approved by the city council last week.

Harrison F. Silver, resident of Russell, Ill, and well known thru-out Lake county, died last week at the home of his brother, C. F. Siver, 521 North Jackson street, Waukegan.

Struck in the back of the head by a charge of buckshot fired by an unknown hunter, Charles Norberg of Winnetka was slightly injured last week. The accident occurred near Wadsworth.


