

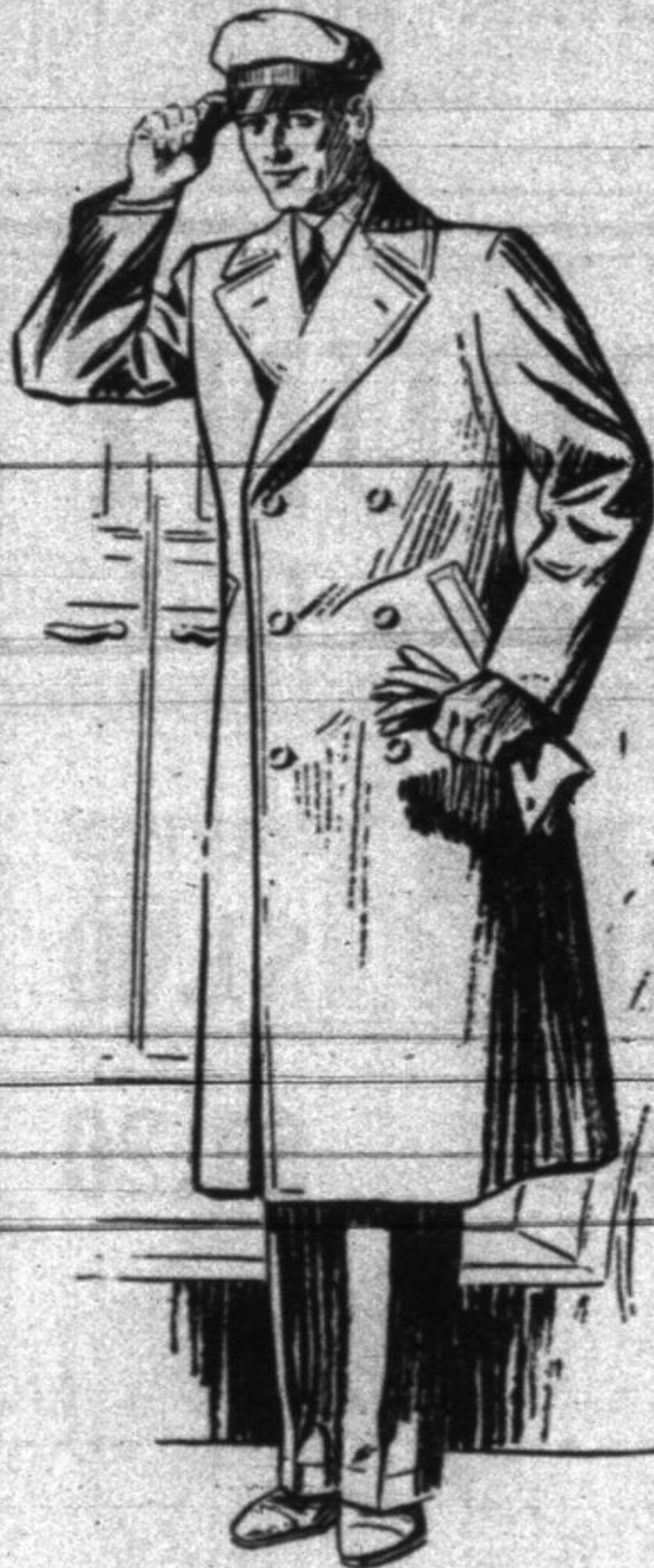

All of the members of the cast and the backstage organization have been selected for the "Torch Bearers," the high school fall play, and work on the production is progressing rapidly. The cast which is working hard to learn their roles by December 5, the date set for its presentation, have also agreed to practice on Saturdays and during the Thanksgiving holidays.

The Cast

Mr. Hosséfrosse, one of society's elite who has a great deal of money which he spends readily in producing amateur theatricals, is to be played by Tom Hawkins, a freshman in Mr. Thurston's session. Mr. Spindler, the right hand man of Mrs. Pampinelli, will be taken by Peter White, a senior in Mr. Eiker's session. Mrs. Nellie Fell, who has been married three times but would like to convince one that she is a 1930 debutante, is being taken by Lillie Moore, a sophomore in Mrs. Bocquin's session. Mrs. J. Duro Pampinelli, a woman greatly

interested in social activities and directress of the society play, will be taken by Helen Jeffries, a senior in Miss Wood's session. Mr. Ralph Twiller, the villain of the society play, is to be taken by Henry Clark, a senior in Mr. Pertz' session.

Miss Florence McCrickett, a young debutante, will be played by Erna Gaede, a sophomore in Miss Bredin's session. Teddy Spearing, a great social necessity, will be taken by Dave Canmann, a senior in Mr. Pertz's session. Mrs. Clara Shepard, who has been cheated out of the leading role in the society play by the death of her husband (for which she will never forgive him), is to be played by Isabel Denzel, a sophomore in Mrs. Bocquin's session. Mr. Stage Manager, a person who always does his duty (generally at the wrong time), will be taken by Ed. Lindau, a senior in Mr. Eiker's session. Jenny, the maid, a faithful servant who has been with the family for years, will be played by Lena Calbri, a sophomore in Miss Morgan's session.

The girls who are assisting Miss Rinkenberger in the production of this play are Catherine Hayward and Robbie Lou Schneider.

The technical director for the play will be Mr. Schneider, industrial arts instructor. Miss Wilson is to be house director, Mrs. Mannings has charge of the orchestra, Mr. Barnes is business director, while the advertising is in charge of Mr. Ballard, Mr. Peers, and Miss Gorman.

Milton Roberts will act as head electrician. His helpers will be Clifton Franklin and Elizabeth Cole.

Maxine Gleason will be in charge of properties with Louise Bieger and Edwin Greig acting as her assistants.

The ticket sales manager will be Leslie Christenson, with Tom Irving as his assistant. The house manager is Jean Morton.

Richard Hastings is to act as advertising manager, with Roy Sorenson as his assistant.

Shop Classes Help

The shop classes, under the direction of Mr. Schneider, are doing such work as making scenery.

The "Torch Bearers" is really a "play within a play," as the characters are presenting a society play for an imaginary audience.
