Whereas it was originally planned to send four delegates to the state convention, it is now possible for many students to attend the national affair in Chicago. Representatives will be chosen from students who are now publishing the Shoreline and from Mr. Peers' and Mr. Ballard's beginning journalism classes.

The convention, which is to be held at the Palmer house, will open Thursday evening with Mr. Lew Sarett, author of many popular books and father of a Deerfield student, presenting a lecture and recital. Frederick M. Snyder, New York newspaperman is also on the program. His subject will be "Keeping ahead of the Headlines." On Friday the round table meetings, covering almost every phase of journalism will be in session. In the evening delegates from every section of the country will be present at the annual banquet and ball.

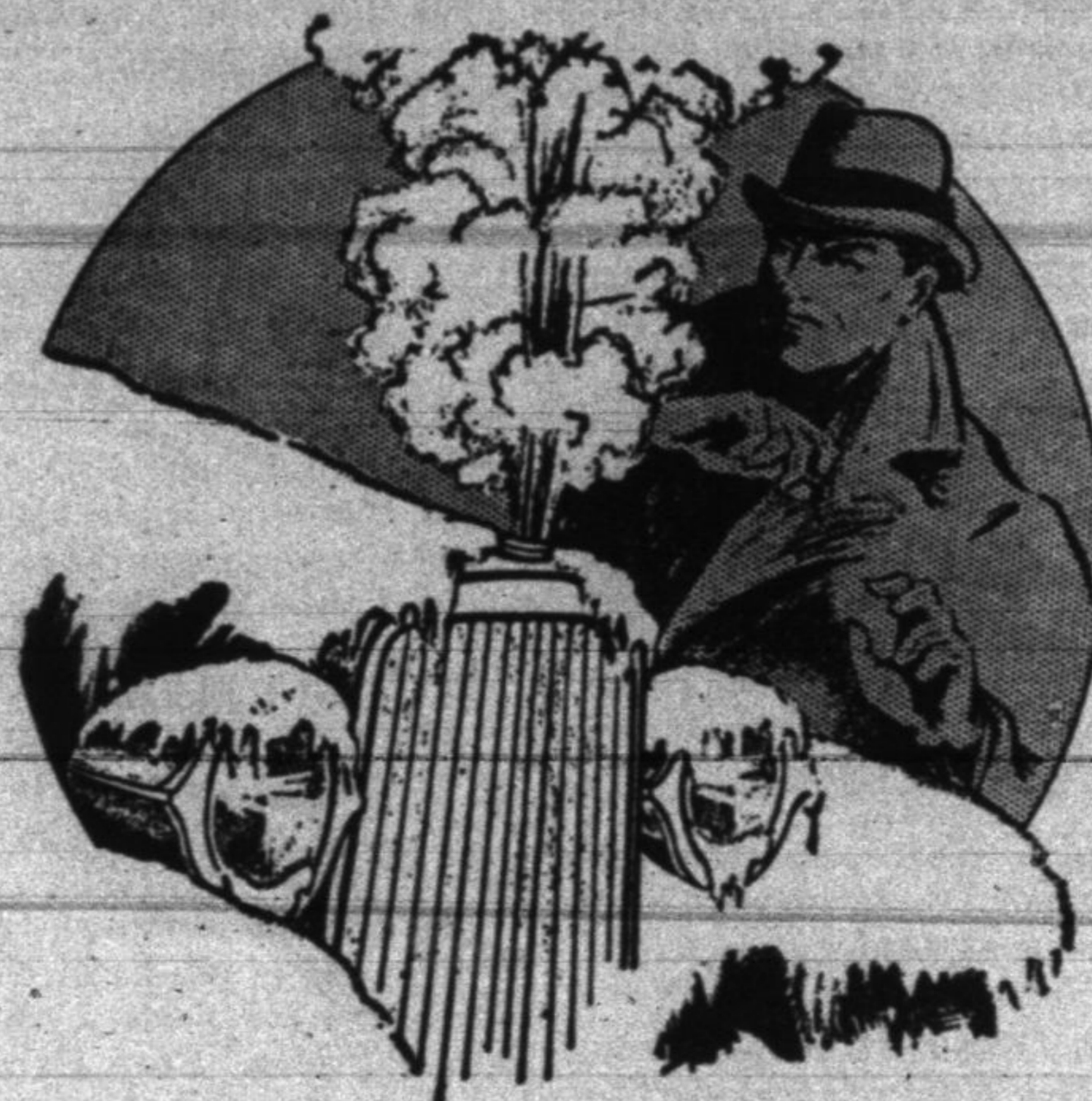
