

County Superintendent Mails Tuition Checks

Checks totaling \$30,411.52 last week were mailed to high schools through the county by W. C. Petty, county school superintendent, as the next to the final payment for the 1930-31 tuition fees due for teaching pupils from non-high school districts.

The Waukegan high school is to

participate to the greatest extent as it will draw \$11,000. Others that will receive checks are as follows: Deerfield-Shields at Highland Park, \$6,000; Libertyville at Libertyville, \$5,000; Antioch at Antioch \$1,500; and Ela at Lake Zurich \$1,500.

Prior to the receipt of this money from the state Petty had paid out approximately \$79,000. The next money to be received from the state will clear up the entire obligation for the fiscal year.
