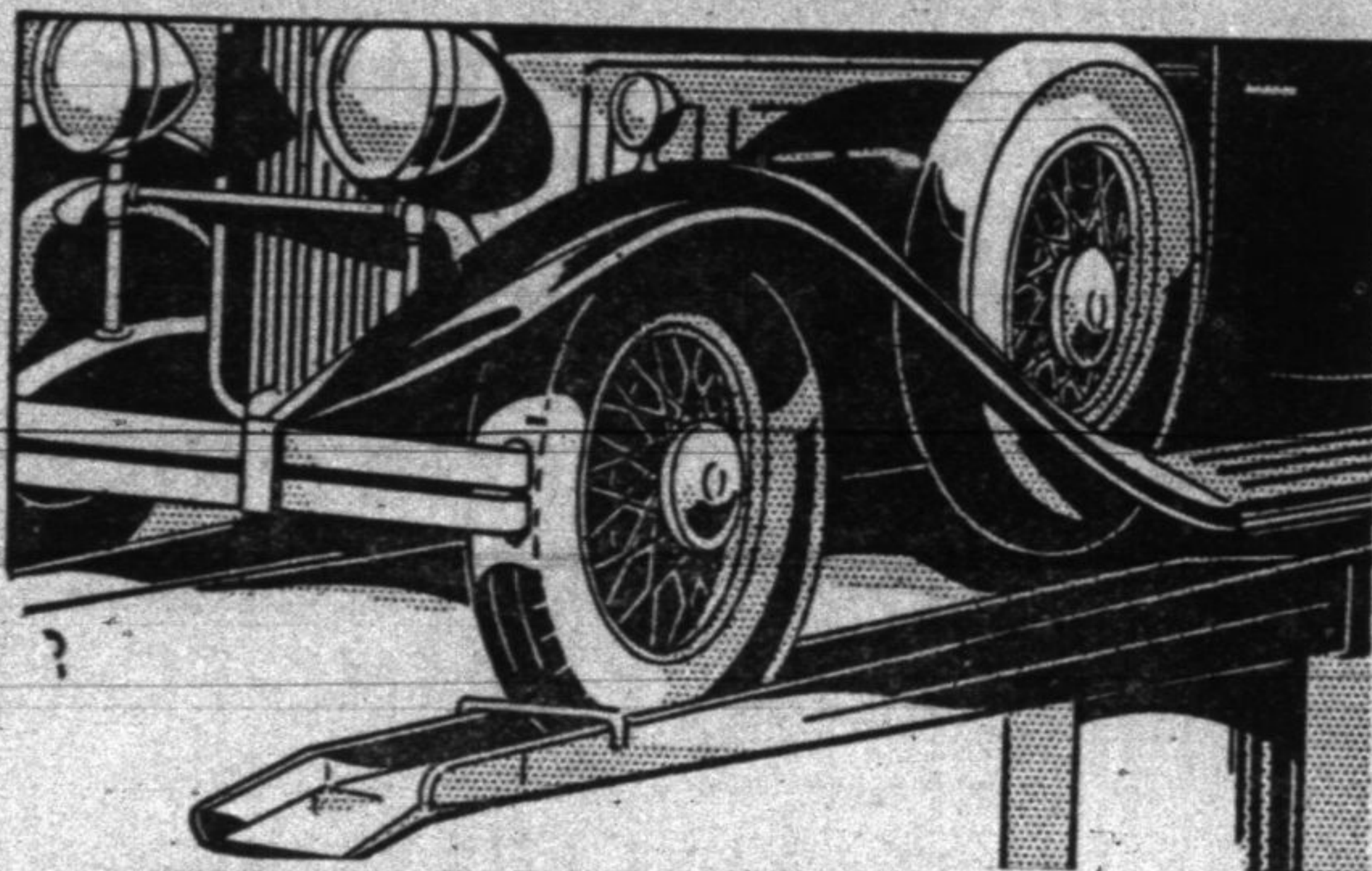

Facilities Inadequate

Finding places for carrying on the indoor programs and leagues continually present the greatest obstacles in the organizing of local community activities and emphasizes the need for a community building with adequate gymnasium facilities, together with a community auditorium, swimming pool, and other club and general recreational facilities. Already all local gymnasiums have reached practically the peak of the load possible to carry, and there is still a great need for gymnasium and club facilities.
