

HATTON TALKS TO VINIA CIVIC ASSN.

Origin and Operation of Municipal Government in U. S.

Who attended the third and in the Ravina series on "ent" heard a very illuminating and instructive discussion on the subject "City Government." R. Hatton, professor of political science at Northwestern University, who delivered the talk, was a most interesting speaker. He spoke from a background of experience, the result of specialization in city government.

Hatton traced the various forms of city government in this country.

There was the simple Anglo-Saxon type, which consisted of a council elected by the people, the council electing a mayor. This worked well, and there was no objection for changing it, except that they thought we should use the system in our city government as used by state and nation.
