Swedish Choir at Bethany Church Is Success; Gift Offer

The Swedish Covenant choir of Chicago, made many friends in Highland Park last Sunday afternoon when they presented one of their fine sacred concerts at the Bethany Evangelical church. The church will filled to utmost capacity with an eager audience, who had been looking forward to this musical treat for the past number of weeks. The Covenant chorus was at its very best, every individual singer carried an important part did it well.

The audience was thrilled with joy when Rev. H. F. Siemsen, the pastor, announced that the Bethany church is to become the recipient of another special gift of \$5,000 coming from the same unnamed donor who is presenting the Bethany church with the sum of \$25,000. The pastor stated that there were but two strings attached to this \$5,000 gift. The first, a cash offering of \$250 should be given on the day of the appearance of the Swedish Covenant choir. (This was accomplished the offering totaled \$265); the other condition being, that this \$5,000 will be the last \$5,000 required in completing the building fund campaign. In other words the entire obligations, with the exception of the last \$5,000 must be met before the end of this month in order to get this gift. Mr. Siemsen reported that all obligations are now cleared with the exception of \$4,700. His appeal was received enthusiastically by the audience and it is believed that many in the community will rally to the help of this church and aid it in securing these two gifts which will total \$30,000.
