**MYSTERY IN DEATH NEAR DEERFIELD**

**Body of Chicago Boy Found Dead from Gunshot Wound in Head; Inquest**

Search for the hunting companion of Willard J. Casey, 18-year-old Carl Schurz high school student, whose body was found Saturday near Deerfield with a gunshot wound in the head, is being made to solve the mysterious shooting which caused the youth's death.

The coroner's jury on Sunday returned an open verdict at the inquest held at the Kelley Funeral Home, Highland Park with the request that Lake county authorities continue the investigation in the boy's death.

Casey's body was found Saturday morning in the Hiawatha woods, about three miles from Deerfield, by John Haggie of Deerfield, while hunting.

**Thought Boy Asleep**

Haggie was about 100 feet from the spot where Casey lay stretched on the brush, but he believed some one was sleeping and he continued on his way. Later in the day he decided to return to the woods and investigate. He then notified Chief of Police P. McLaughlin at Deerfield.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Thomas E. Kennedy and Coroner John L. Taylor were called to the scene.

They found the body, dressed in a dark suit and chinchilla overcoat and black oxfords, frozen. To the right of him, almost parallel to the body, was a double barrel shotgun with the right shot discharged.

**Shot in Head**

The shot had struck Casey at the right temple and tore away both eyes and the bridge of his nose.

Both of Casey's hands had gloves on them and they were in his coat pockets. His cap was on the ground, about six feet from the body.

In Casey's pockets was found a hunting license, obtained on Nov. 28 in Chicago. He had given his age as 21.

A membership card was found which bore the following printed words.

"The Order of the Builders, Irving Park chapter 22. Otto F. Scholz, secretary." This order is a junior branch of the Masonic lodge.

**Are in Doubt**

"From the position of the body, we could not ascertain whether it was a suicide or that Casey had been killed by some one else," Chief Deputy Sheriff Kennedy stated.
