Mr. and Mrs. W. B. Carr and Mrs. Grace Cottrell were the week-end guests of Mrs. Emma Cahill of Milwaukee.

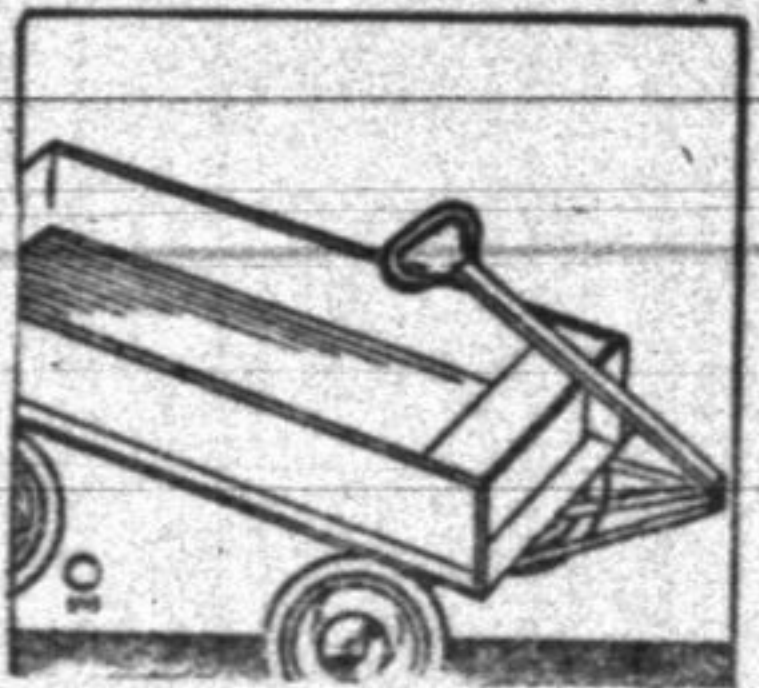
