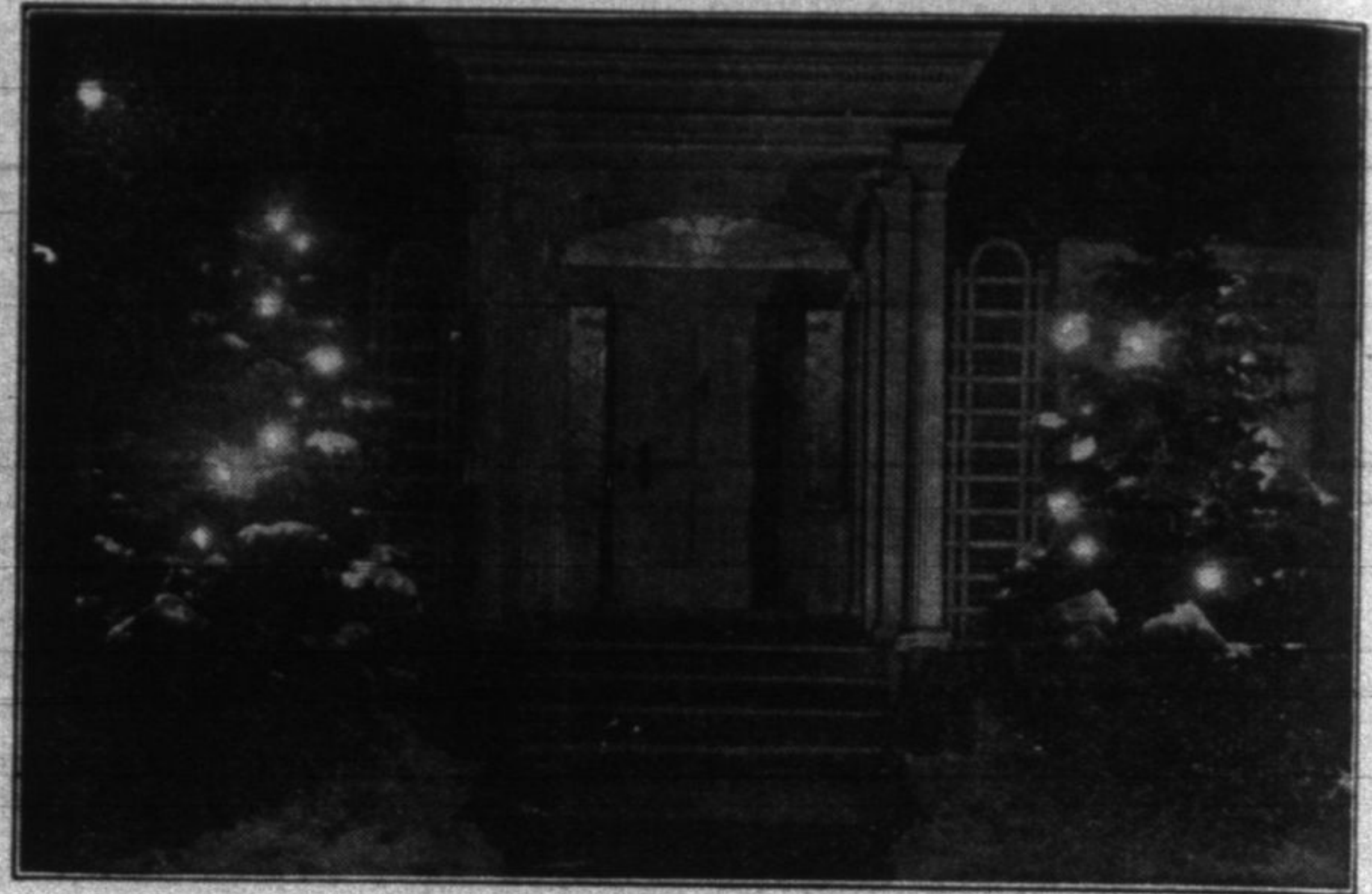

**Bogus Check Artists
Caught at Highwood

Two confessed check passers who employed a young boy in a swindle scheme were arrested in Highwood Saturday when they attempted to pass a \$24 check on Charles Glass for the second time in two weeks.

Glass, a justice of the peace and dry goods merchant, sold one of the swindlers a pair of shoes for a 12-year-old boy who accompanied him, and recognized his customer when the latter attempted to pay for his purchase with a check. Glass detained him while Mrs. Glass called the police.

Policeman Pete Andreotti took the check passer into custody. He identified himself as John Damski, 36, of Chicago. His colleague was arrested by Chief Iver Iverson when the boy told police that Thomas Karner, 1943 W. Monroe st., was waiting on the corner of Waukegan and North avenues.

Karner admitted his part in the swindle and confessed he had bought five checks in Chicago for \$10. The pair were identified by Glass and the Fells brothers, Highland Park shoe dealers.

**Dr. Taylor Announces
He Will Be Candidate
to Succeed Himself**

Dr. John L. Taylor of Libertyville, coroner of Lake county for the last 23 years, announced last week that he will be a candidate for renomination in the Republican primary next spring.

Petitions for the veteran coroner will be circulated starting after the first of the year by his many friends. Although there had been numerous reports to the effect that Dr. Taylor would not seek the office of coroner again, he declared that he was ready and would ask for another term on the basis of his long record as coroner of Lake county.

Dr. Taylor is widely known throughout the county as the result of his long practice and service as coroner. Edward Conrad, Waukegan, former deputy coroner and former chairman of the Lake county board, has already entered the race for coroner and will oppose Dr. Taylor.

Dr. J. E. Walters and Lawrence Doolittle, ex-sheriff, are other prospective candidates for the office in the spring primaries.

**N. Chicagoan Pleads
Guilty of Uxoricide**

Louis Hankins, 24, of North Chicago, last week, pleaded guilty to the murder of his wife, Inez, before Judge Ralph J. Dady and was sentenced to serve 30 years at the Joliet penitentiary.

Hankins, sitting with his head bowed and coughing frequently listened to Fred Coleman, brother of the dead woman, and the mother of his murdered wife, relate in what condition they found Inez shortly after 3 o'clock on the morning of March 24. Chief of Police Edward Carroll of North Chicago told that he found the woman, in bed, with her head split and an axe covered with blood.

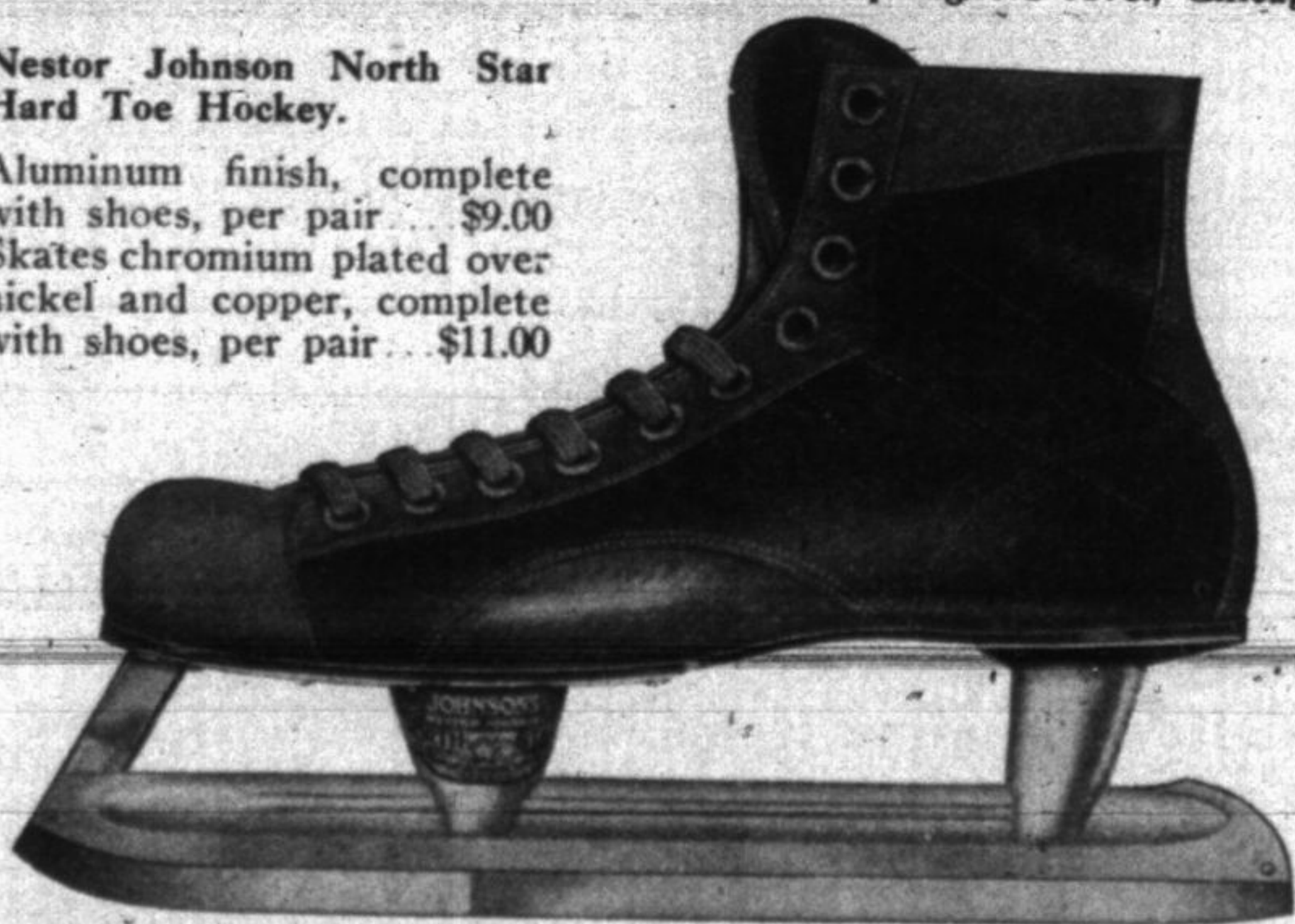
