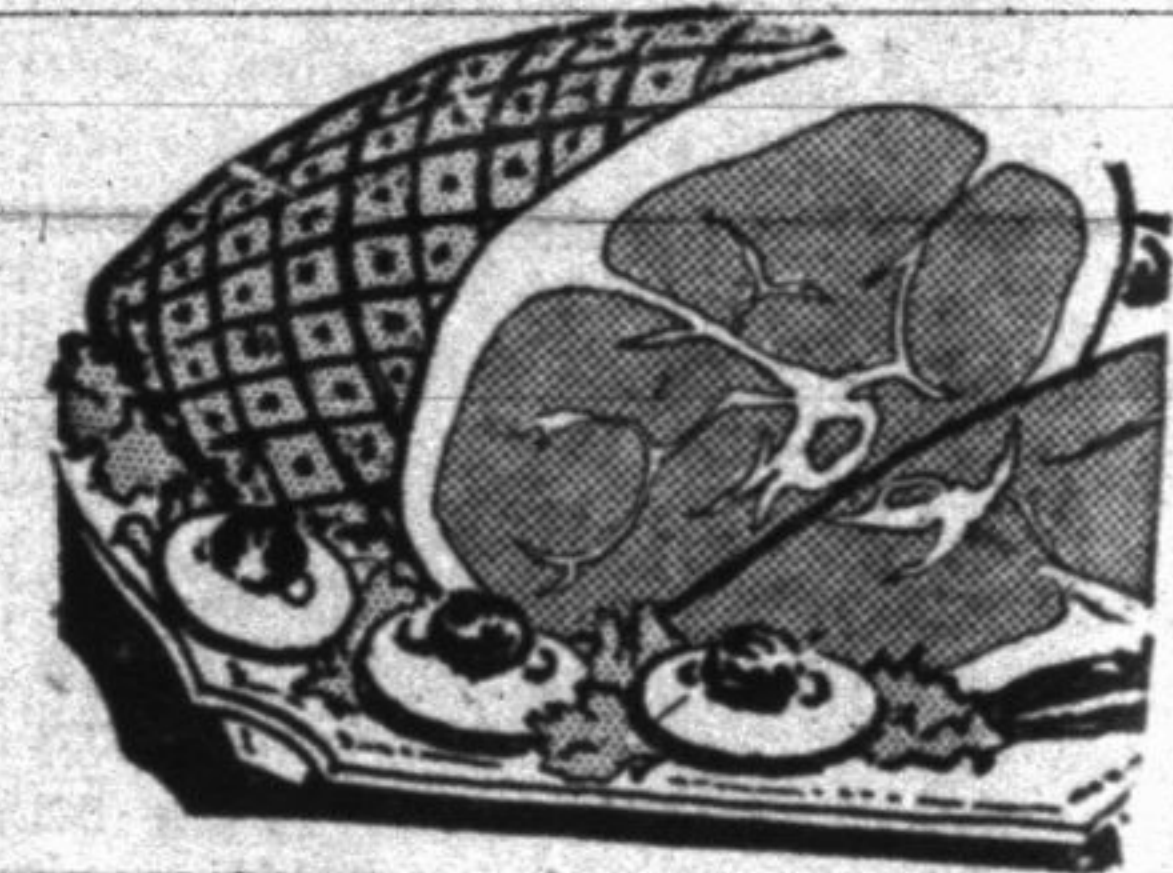
Mothers Club Meets at Wilmot School
