## URGING PASSAGE OF SCHOOL RELIEF BILL

Senator Ray Paddock, all of the eighth district.

These members of the general assembly were urged to support House Bill No. 72, and they are reported to have agreed to do so.

Mr. Murray explained the situation confronting North Shore school districts, especially, and pointed out how necessary it is that the schools be given more latitude in taxation, if their organizations are not to be seriously curtailed and efficiency reduced.

### Situation Complicated

The situation as confronting the legislature is complicated because of several other bills on school taxation presented in connection with the effort to relieve tax conditions in Cook county, and also by the attitude of the farm bloc in the legislature which is sponsoring an income tax bill and the elimination of the state distributive school fund.

The situation in school district No. 107, in Highland Park, is so critical that last year a citizens' committee raised \$150,000 a year for three years by private subscription to pay the operating deficit in order to maintain its schools. This is said to be the only case on record where a community has raised a public school operating deficit by private subscription because tax revenues were insufficient. District 108, here, also urgently needs relief in this direction.

### Of Vital Importance

The proposed legislation is of vital importance to every child in Waukegan, Fox Lake, North Chicago, Deerfield, Highwood, Highland Park and to many other cities throughout the state.
