

N. S. REALTY BOARD IN ANNUAL MEETING

**Held Monday Night; Officers
Are Elected; Membership
Is Increased**

The North Shore Real Estate Board Monday night, at its annual meeting in the Shawnee Country club, elected Arthur Lee president for 1932, Clarence L. Drayer vice-president, A. R. Eddington secretary-treasurer, and Jules Dixon a director for three years.

This slate of officers was selected by the following nominating committee, named at the November 16 meeting: E. Sawyer Smith, Alder R. Tighe, Margaret E. Byrne, Robert L. Wyatt, and Frank A. Reid.

Jules Dixon, retiring president, was the principal speaker last night. He asserted that the most outstanding accomplishment of the past year was the formation of a permanent advisory council.

Advisory Council

Members of this council, all past-presidents, are: H. H. Brown, Wilmette; E. Sawyer Smith, Winnetka; R. L. Wyatt, Glenview; L. T. Dodds, Winnetka; H. R. Vant, Deerfield, and A. J. Wodstock, Wilmette. A certificate of honorable service and membership has been presented to each man.

One of the principal developments with the board was a thorough study of the by-laws, according to Dixon. Under the direction of Howard H. Brown, these were amended

and brought up to date where necessary.

The offices of secretary and treasurer were combined, and the position placed on a salary basis. Under Brown's direction a comprehensive historical record of the board has been prepared. Messers. Stone and Reid assisted in this work.

Membership Grows

Under the direction of Harold R. Vant of Deerfield, membership of the board was increased 53 per cent during the year, Dixon reported.

The North Shore board draws its membership from Deerfield, Glencoe, Northbrook, Highland Park, Hubbard Woods, Kenilworth, Wheeling, Wilmette, Winnetka, Lake Forest and contiguous territory.

All Hamilton's truly great patriotic contributions to his country's welfare are made incidental to a notorious love affair in this story. We know some heroes had clay feet; but surely there is no necessity of focussing the camera on their weak-

nesses. The production is excellent, splendid cast, and aside from this feature, one of the finest pictures of the year. "Palmy Days" will find many champions as a funny, fast, musical comedy, a masterpiece of clever sets, and pretty girls, if you like Cantor and his comedy you will be highly entertained. To find "Devotion" on the same program is giving one a great deal for one admission. Ann Harding and Leslie Howard are perfectly teamed in this somewhat illogical but entertaining comedy drama.
