Workman at Waukegan
Caught in Cave-in Is
Rescued; Back at Work

Trapped by the cave-in of a sewer ditch at 312 Gillette avenue, and unable to extricate his imprisoned body, Ali Mamas, 40, of 213 Lake street, Waukegan, a plumber's assistant, suffered intense pain last week before central station firemen could free him. "I wasn't killed," he said. "I'm going back to work now."

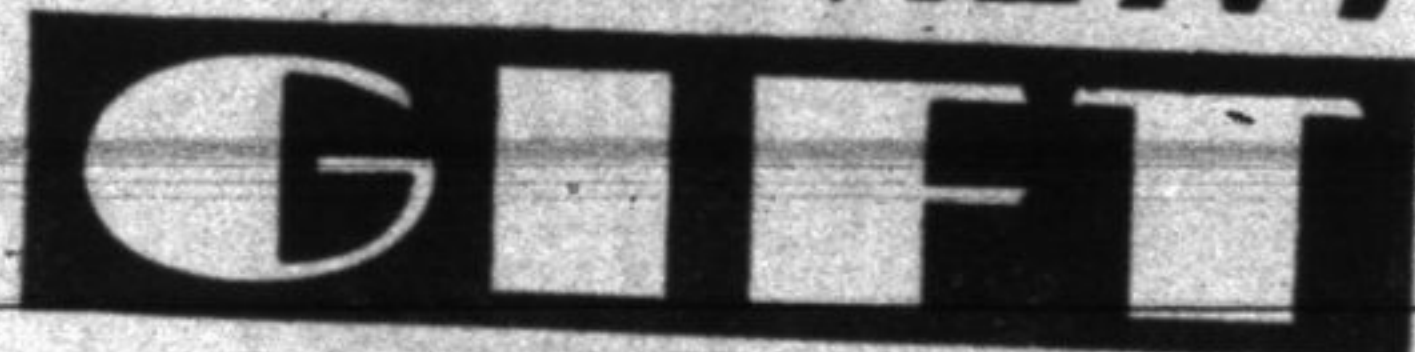
