In answer to numerous queries regarding the number of types of legislative measures passed in the General Assembly during the last regular session, Representative Richard J. Lyons analyzes activities in an article appearing in a recent issue of the publication, "Real Es-

Lyons' report reveals that 2,031 bills were introduced into the house and senate of which 492 were enacted into law. Forty-three of these were new laws.

Exactly 331 bills originated in the house of which 95 were appropriation measures, 196 amendments to existing laws, one a repeal act, ten validating acts, and 29 new laws.
