"Mechanical Lung" Now Available for North Shore Hospitals Use

A Drinker respirator, or "mechanical lung," is now available to Lake county and other north shore hospitals. This fact became known when it was announced by the Public Service Company of Northern Illinois, that a machine had been established in the medical department of the company and would be loaned on request to any hospital in this district that may require it in case of emergency.

Several hospitals located at strategic points about the city of Chicago and suburbs have received respirators as gifts from the various local public utility companies since this new machine proved its value in the saving of human life. The respirator now made available to all other hospitals insures that prompt treatment can be given to all cases, irrespective of where they may develop, without the patient having to be removed to an institution where a "mechanical lung" is located.

"The respirator which we have purchased embodies all the latest improvements to this remarkable life-saving device," said Dr. Hart Ellis Fisher, chief surgeon of the Public Service company. "It will be maintained and serviced by the medical department in the heart of the Chicago loop at 79 West Monroe street, where our offices are located.

Huge Output of Flags in U. S. Is Shown in Revenue Dept. Report

It would take 2,378,000 years for one man to smoke up a year's output of American cigarets if he smoked six cigarets an hour, day and night. Bureau of Internal Revenue figures show that almost 120 billion cigarets were made last year for consumption in this country, while Department of Commerce figures show that exports accounted for almost 5 billion more.

This production of approximately 125 billion cigarets a year is made possible through the adoption of modern manufacturing methods, as typified by such advances as the toasting process including the use of ultra violet rays which is employed by a leading manufacturer for the removal of certain harmful irritants naturally present in every tobacco leaf. Smoking six cigarets an hour, a man could consume 144, or a little more than 7 packages a day.

Even at this extraordinary high rate of smoking speed, this champion smoker would consume only 52,560 cigarets a year. Counting the 144 cigarets he would be able to add to his annual total every fourth year, he would have to keep steadily puffing away to finish his 125 billion in the allotted time.
