OBSERVE WASHINGTON BICENTENNIAL, 1932

Celebration from Feb. 22 to Thanksgiving; Writer Points Effects

A concise statement of the scope of the George Washington Bicentennial celebration, which is to extend to every city and village of the United States next year, appears in the current issue of the National Republic, written by Congressman Sol Bloom, of New York, associate director of the George Washington Bicentennial commission. How the celebration is to be made so wide-spread is described by Mr. Bloom as follows:

"In America the United States George Washington Bicentennial commission will not limit the commemoration to one place or one date. On the contrary, it has repeatedly emphasized the fact that it is carry-

ing the celebration to the people. It will accomplish this as follows:

Celebration Period

"The celebration period will last from February 22, 1932, until the following Thanksgiving Day. Every municipality of community in the land is expected to set aside within that specified period of celebration, a number of holidays and patriotic dates—the more, the better—on which it will stage ceremonies and festivities appropriate to the event.

"That is to say, for almost ten months the people of the United States, through a series of exercises reaching from coast to coast and from the Lakes to the Gulf, will be continuously told about the personality and work of George Washington. In this way the nation will perforce become Washington-minded. Everybody will discuss George Washington, his principles, deeds and ideals.

"To every citizen it will be a matter of pride to know exactly what manner of man George Washington

was, and the many ways in which he contributed to the freedom of the American colonies, to the founding of this nation and to the creation and form of its government. This being so, it will naturally follow that every adult will become a better citizen, for it is impossible for any normal man or woman to come under the influence of George Washington without responding with the resolve to do better work for the country and community.

Children to Benefit

"But it is the children especially who will benefit from the Bicentennial observance. Their idealism is high. Their minds are plastic. Upon the tablets of their imagination it is easy to imprint noble thoughts, uplifting memories and inspiring ambitions. They will be so impressed with the story of George Washington that they will carry him in their hearts and minds for the rest of their lives as the model of good citizenship and public service.
