SOME FACTS ABOUT ELECTIONS IN 1932

Offices in County to Be Filled; Candidates; Dates of Filing, Etc.

While prospective candidates for Lake county offices and precinct committeemen are circulating petitions to have their names placed on the ballots of the two major parties at the primary election on April 12, opening and closing dates for the filing of petitions were announced last week in County Clerk Lew A. Hendee's office.

In addition to the county offices to be filled in 1932, including the recorder, circuit clerk, the coroner and the precinct committeemen, the county at large will elect a county auditor for the first time in the history of the county.

Must Elect Auditor

Under the federal census of 1930, Lake county has to choose its auditor by ballot. In counties of 100,000 or more, according to the state statutes, the auditors are to be elected by popular vote instead of being appointed by the board of supervisors. For the past 20 years Samuel Sims of Pontiac has been named from year to year to audit the county accounts.

Men capable of examining the county accounts have been suggested as candidates for county auditor by the Republican and the Democratic parties. Robert Pearsall, deputy county clerk and former Waukegan city commissioner, has strong backing in the urban and rural sections of the county as a Republican candidate. Justice Henry Wallenwein and Thomas Sexton have been mentioned frequently for the party office.

On the Democratic ticket, the names of Edward McDermott and R. H. Stripe have been offered.

Must File Before Feb. 6
 The first day for filing petitions for county offices is Feb. 6. The last day is Feb. 22. Those dates are also applicable to the various candidates for state offices.

The state conventions of the major parties will be held April 22, ten days after the primaries to take action on the gubernatorial and other state candidates.

Following are the dates for the filing and withdrawal of petitions and for various sessions in connection with the primary:

Feb. 6—First day for filing petitions with the secretary of state, and for county officers with the county clerk.

Feb. 12—First day for filing petitions for precinct committeemen with the county clerk.

Feb. 22—Last day for filing petitions with the secretary of state, and for county officers with the county clerk.

Feb. 27—Last day to file withdrawals with the secretary of state.

March 3—Last day to file for precinct committeemen.

March 8—Last day for meeting of senatorial committees for each political party to fix and determine the number of candidates to be nominated for representative in the general assembly.

March 8—Last day to file withdrawal with county clerk.

March 8—Last day for state certifying board to certify names of candidates to county clerk.
 March 23—Last day to prepare notices of primary.
 March 28—Last day for posting notices of primary.
 March 28—Last day to post and publish announcement of color of ballots.
 April 7—Last day to post specimen ballots.
 April 11—Last day for delivering primary ballots.
 April 12—Primary election.
 April 14—Last day for judges to deliver returns to clerk.
 April 18—Meeting of county central committee.
 April 22—State convention held.
