Following the demonstration, training courses in eight different subjects covering leadership training in as many different phases of Scout work went into action. The courses were:

1. Elements of scoutmastership.
2. Principles of scoutmastership.
3. First aid course.
4. Commissioner's course.
5. Troop committeemen's course.
6. Cub Leader's course.
7. Elementary Sea Scout Leadership.
8. Advanced Sea Scout Leadership.

Over 100 men attended. The next session will be held on Monday, Jan. 25, again at the Elm Place school when Mr. Gunnar H. Berg, National director of Volunteer Training will be the principal speaker.
