St. Paul's Church Holds Annual Meeting Jan. 3

The annual meeting of St. Paul's was held Sunday, Jan. 3. George C. Sticken, secretary, offered the minutes of the 1931 meeting. The financial reports by Fred Horenberger as treasurer and Mr. C. A. Selig as financial secretary followed.

In consideration of the great economic depression the reports were most encouraging, assuring members that St. Paul's can begin 1932 with a perfectly clean slate. The year 1932 no doubt will be the crucial year. But even in the face of this fact the church council expressed every hope and assurance that the members and friends of the church will lend every possible assistance to carry thru 1932 successfully.

The proposal of St. John's Evangelical church, Highland Park, to unite St. John's and St. Paul's Evangelical churches into one parish to be served by the pastor, Rev. F. G. Piepenbrok, was accepted. St. Paul's church need make only one concession, their time of service will go on the former schedule, 10:15, instead of 10:30. Change of time will go into effect on the first Sunday in February.

The election of officers brought little change; C. A. Selig, Fred La Bahn, and Julius Johnson were re-elected. George C. Sticken, who has served five years as secretary, requested to be released from his duties. Arthur Borchardt of Highland Park was elected for a term of two years.
