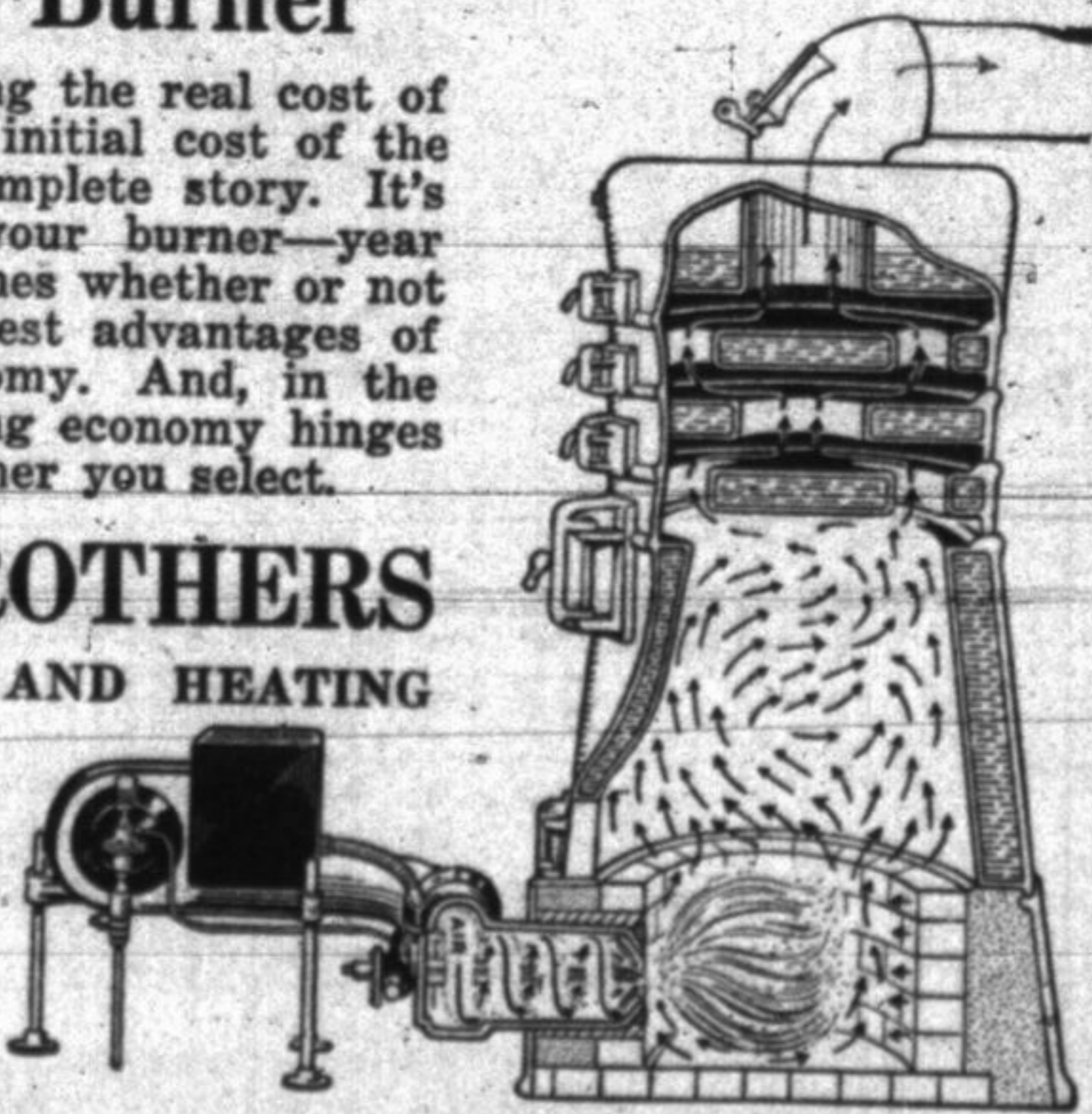

STUDYING CURRENTS OF LAKE MICHIGAN

Government Experts Testing to Determine Cause of Trend Along Shore

Unusually strong currents in Lake Michigan, that have damaged fishing nets upon many occasions, are being given close study by government experts and commercial fishermen.

Causes of the currents in Lake Michigan this year have aroused widespread interest among navigators and fishermen, but as yet, no explanation for them has been found.

The United States bureau of fishery has been conducting an investigation, through a series of bottles which were dropped into the lake at various points earlier in the year. The bottles were placed by the Fulmar, a government boat.

Check on Drift

These bottles contained instructions for their return, with information as to where they had been picked up by the finders and other important data needed by the government workers. Approximately 283 bottles were dropped into the lake and already over 100 have been returned.

One bottle which was tossed into the lake and later picked up showed that it had drifted at an average rate of 10 miles per day.

When all the bottles have been returned, the government expects to obtain some very interesting and enlightening data on the lake currents. A detailed study of the course followed by each bottle will be made and charted and the results compared with those of other studies.

Little Damage Locally

Waukegan fishermen have not reported any damaged nets, other than in instances where large objects have been caught in them, but along other sections of the lake damage has been heavy.

Many drifting nets have caused Waukegan fishermen trouble and some anxiety, however, it was reported. Crews of fishing tugs have often been forced to hunt for hours for their nets which had drifted before a strong wind.

Defense Attorneys Are Paid by State

Attorney Bernard Decker and Marshall Meyer of Waukegan are to receive \$250 from the state for defending Toribio Dela Cruz, convicted for murder, according to an order, signed last week by Judge Ralph J. Dady.

The two lawyers were appointed by the court to defend Dela Cruz at the murder trial because the man was unable to obtain counsel. Under the state statutes, lawyers appointed by the court to defend persons at a murder trial are entitled to their fees from the state.
