Pioneer Railroad Man Retires From

Thomas A. Newnham of 508 N. County street, pioneer Waukegan resident and station agent and telegrapher at the North Western depot here for many years, was officially retired from service with the Chicago and North Western railroad on Jan. 1, after being with the company 41 years. He is 65 years old. *

Mr. Newnham came with the North Western road on July 16, 1890 from the New York Central railroad and after serving for short periods at various stations along the Wisconsin division, located in Waukegan and has been at the local depot for 40 years.
