The La Salle line this year shows a new model, the five-passenger town coupe with a body by Fisher. This newest La Salle has extra large front seats which fold forward, when desired. Ample leg room is provided for passengers in the broad rear seat, and an exceptionally large built in trunk compartment makes this car ideal for touring.

Broadcloth, whipcord and mohair upholstery are offered on all cars, and in designs that will please the most discriminating motorist.

All the new Cadillacs and La Salle closed models offer greater headroom and wider seats this year, and the shoulder room has been increased by three inches. Dome and quarter lights of appealing design are shown in these cars. Both sedans and imperials are equipped with robe rails, and, in many of the models, these rails are covered with upholstery cloth.

Genuine walnut smoking and vanity sets are among the many appointments found in the imperial and sedan models. And all the closed models, both Cadillac and La Salle, are provided with ash receptacles located at the top of the instrument panel for the convenience of the driver and front seat passenger.

Incidentally, on all open models ash receptacles are provided in all four doors. Phaetons also have folding center arm rests in the rear seats. An improved type of top is used on the new Cadillac-LaSalle models, this year, and they are extremely easy to operate. Teal cloth is used for top covering on all open and convertible models.

The all-weather phaetons are provided with glass partitions between the tonneau and the front compartment. This partition can be raised or lowered at will.
