### Local Resident Says Churchill Versatile, But His French Bad

William Kerr, 1223 Pleasant avenue, Highland Park, contributes the following, under date of Feb. 2, 1932, regarding the British statesman, Winston Churchill, who has been visiting in Chicago and other cities in this country of late. Mr. Kerr says:

Winston Churchill, the British statesman, who is now in Chicago is one of the most versatile of living men. He has been a competent soldier; a useful war correspondent, and an unofficial Commander in Chief of the Antwerp defence force. He is a historian of the first rank. Can lay bricks accurately, and in as quick time as the professional, and is at least a gifted amateur painter. But according to a gossip writer, he cannot speak idiomatic French. The memoirs of the late Lord Asquith record a luncheon, which he attended with DeCasse, Cambon, and Sir Edward Grey in 1915. "W. Churchill was eloquent in the worst French anyone ever heard," the report stated.
