CHURCHES JOIN IN BOY SCOUT WEEK PROGRAMS

The Boy Scouts of America, which in Boy Scout week, Feb. 7-13, 1932 celebrates its twenty-second anniversary, has been described as an organization almost unique in that the Boy Scout platform is one upon which those of all religious bodies and all races, may unite. It is pointed out that the Scout oath and law, from which Scouting radiates, is to be found not only in America, but throughout the world and is the base upon which the Scout Movement stands.

There are strong Protestant, Catholic and Jewish committees and members of all three religious groups sit on the national executive board of the Boy Scouts of America. Scouting is conducted not as an activity of any one of these religious bodies, but as a Movement in which all may participate, always conscious of a splendid program drafted and built for all boys.

Troops on the north shore, particularly where they are sponsored by churches as so many of them are, will attend church in a body, wearing the Scout uniform and in many cases take part in the service. Pastors of many churches are preparing special Scout sermons for either Feb. 7 or 15. Troop 77 of Mundelein is dramatizing Scouting in connection with their church at Sunday evening Scout service on Feb. 14.

More than fifty per cent of all the Scout troops in the United States are sponsored by churches of the various religious bodies. On the north shore 65 per cent of all units are sponsored by churches, including 19 to 22 Cub packs, 31 of 54 Scout troops and four out of seven Sea Scout ships. Scout leaders say they are particularly happy over this circumstance because of the fine atmosphere which exists which is wholesome for boys, also because the church can mobilize man-power worthy to set an example for boys. From the standpoint of parents, there is confidence in the church and its activities which gives an assurance that boys are at meetings or engaged in other activities under most wholesome circumstances. Furthermore, the church as an institution, has an assured quality of permanence.

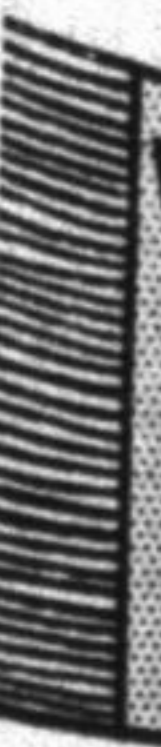
