### Campaign Against Rats Is Started in Waukegan City

War has been declared against rats and mice in Waukegan and sanitary officers, working under the direction of Dr. John C. Foley, city health officer, last week, started a campaign to rid the city of all rodents.

H. A. Ferris was named deputy health officer by Dr. Foley to have charge of the field work in ridding the city of the rats.

"Rodents are a great menace to the health of a community, due to numerous diseases carried and spread by the filthy pests—chief of these being pneumonic and bubonic plagues, tuberculosis, scarlet fever and typhoid fever," Dr. Foley stated.

Since the beginning of the Hong Kong epidemic in 1893, the bubonic plague has been spread to all parts of the world. Aside from being carriers of disease, rats cost the United States \$200,000,000 annually in food consumed and spoiled.

The method to be used in fighting the rodents in Waukegan, according to Ferris, is to be a systematic extermination process, taking district by district in the entire city. Poisons dangerous to humans will not be used, Ferris said, but bacterial cultures, china cantharides and red squill powder will be applied. There will be no charge in the fight against the rats, except the cost of the materials used, Ferris stated.

### Doolittle Not to Run for Coroner

Lawrence A. Doolittle, former sheriff, last week admitted that he would not enter the Republican primaries for coroner, which cuts the field to three candidates in the G. O. P. division.

"I am trying to build up my oil business now, and it is getting in shape so that I will need my time, which would have to go to a campaign if I ran for coroner," he said.

The removal of Doolittle from the primary leaves Coroner John L. Taylor, Edward Conrad and Dr. J. E. Walter in the G. O. P. lists.

### Bill Affecting City's Deposits and Interest Passed by Legislature

The bill introduced by Representative Richard J. Lyons in the state assembly, affecting Highland Park and other communities having the commission form of government, was passed Feb. 3 by the senate and forwarded to Gov. L. L. Emmerson.

This legislation removes the restrictions on the city treasurers on the bank deposits of city funds and removes the requirement for a minimum of 3 per cent interest demanded for city funds in the banks. Bankers have refused to accept deposits under those requirements and city treasurers have been confronted with posting additional bonds for money kept in the city treasury.
